If you are unable to stand for all of it, please sit. But stand for the final moments of Jesus' life at the words "Near the Cross, stood Mary his Mother". It is traditional to genuflect or bow at the words marking Jesus' death.

A reflection on God's word

We reverence the Cross

The cross is carried through the building and the procession stops three times. Each time the cross is raised for all to see and all should genuflect or bow as the following words are said

The cross of Christ.

All The cross on which the Saviour of the world was hung.

The Cross is held at the front and all are invited to come forward and reverence it as a sign of worship and adoration of Jesus who died upon the cross for our salvation. Please feel free to kneel silently or bow before the cross. Alternatively if you prefer please remain kneeling in your place in and gaze the cross in stillness reflecting on it and offering our prayers as a sign of worship and adoration of Jesus who died upon the cross for our salvation At the end of a time of reflection

We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you,

All because by your holy cross

you have redeemed the world.

This is the wood of the cross,

on which hung the Saviour of the world.

All Come, let us worship.

O Saviour of the world, who by your cross and precious blood have redeemed us,

All save us and help us, we humbly pray.

We pray at the foot of the cross

The following response is used

Lord, hear us.

Lord graciously hear us.

The prayers may conclude with a collect, or after the final prayer the following response

Merciful Father
accept these prayers
for the sake of your Son,
our Saviour, Jesus Christ.
Amen.

The Sacrament is placed on the Altar

Sing, my tongue, the glorious battle, sing the last, the dread affray; o'er the cross, the victor's trophy, sound the high triumphal lay, how, the pains of death enduring, Earth's Redeemer won the day.
