Lastly on July 23<sup>rd</sup> we gathered to say thank you and farewell



to Revd Sam as she leaves us for Fareham. We gave thanks for her care, prayer and leadership over the past 3 years and for her commitment and passion for social justice, especially the environment and the work of Hope into Action. We will miss her and Lionel and will hold

them in our prayers as they preapre to move. We do not have a licensing date yet for Revd Sam either – as she needs to wait for Wedny May to move out of the Vicarage at Fareham and then for some works to happen there before she can move in., We will let you have a date as soon as we have one. Revd Sam was grateful for the farewell gift from the Parish of B & Q tokens to help provide Garden Furniture for their new home.



The new PCC met for the first time in July and we disussed a number of things including our current communion practices post COVID. There is a 50/50 split as to whether we should resume sharing the

chalice or continue with intinction. It was agreed to enable all of us to



share the common cup we would continue with intinction and review again in the Autumn. We did, however, agree to restore the chairs to full rows throughout the Church. This would still enable those

who wish to sit apart form people to select areas to do that, but would also enable us to bring to St Mary's the remaining Blue Chairs from St WIIfird's

The PCC also had a chance to hear the result of the inspection of the Reredos at St Mary's. The team that inspected it were impressed with the quality of the art and craft and the good condition it is in. there are however some areas that need cleaning and treating and the estimate for the works is some  $\pounds$ 45K! The PCC are considering how they might cover these costs or find funds to do so.
