This year we will be celebrating **our Harvest Festival on Sunday October** Ist. This comes at the end of Generosity week (a Diocesan wide project).

Over the last few weeks, we have had some **good news** in partnership with Fratton Big Local. Those of you who visited the 'Ship of Gods' light installation 2 years ago will remember how impressive it was. We have been successful in an application to the Arts Council to commission the

artists Heinrich and Palmer, who live in Fratton, to create a new light installation. This will use St Mary's Church as its focus and music from the Organ project, 'Once a sea' will be ready for its premier in November 2024 and we will keep you up to date with its development.



In the meantime, for this year's **Festival of Light** we are working on hosting 'The Sun' in the Church from **Nov 16**th – 23rd – following on from 'The Museum of the Moon' last year – this will be another amazing piece and there will be many opportunities to visit it and share in

various activities under the sun! Alongside this will be the lantern Parade and there will be a chance at the Autumn Fair to come and make some lanterns to use at it.

Other good news was that the long-awaited purchase of the Bridge Centre by the City Council has been approved. **This means St**Mary's and Fratton Big Local will be able to have a unit on

Fratton Road in which to run a Pantry – more details of this will follow – and we hope some of our congregations will get involved as volunteers helping us to run this much needed community resource.
