As we begin the journey towards the cross, this evening we reflect on the ashes we normally use as signs of our emptiness without God's presence with us and pray for the grace to keep a holy Lent that we may be ready to celebrate the mystery of Easter.

The Imposition of Ashes

The Ashes are blessed and you are invited to come forward and receive the ashes on our foreheads as a sign of our penitence. A Minister will also come to those in the seats at the West End – if you do not wish to receive the ashes please sit

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ.

During the Imposition the Choir sing an anthem.

Once all have received the Ashes the Priest says a prayer and all respond
