The Priest addresses the parents and Godparents

God knows each of us by name and we are his.

Will you pray for them and help them to follow Christ?

Parents and Godparents We will

We renew our promises

The Priest addresses the parents and Godparents and, today, as we recall our own Baptism invites all who are baptised to renew our own Baptismal Promises.

We all wander far from God and lose our way:

Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home.

In baptism we respond to his call.

Therefore I ask:

Do you turn away from sin?

I do.

Do you reject evil?

I do.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

I do.

Do you trust in him as Lord?

I do.

The Signing with the Cross

The Priest, using oil blest by the Bishop for this purpose,

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.

Do not be ashamed of Christ. You are his for ever.

Stand bravely with him against all the powers of evil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

Amen.

The Water is Blessed

The Priest asks God to bless the water for the baptism

Praise God who made heaven and earth,

who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The Priest says the prayer of blessing.

We profess our faith

Brothers and sisters, let us affirm, together with these who are being baptised, our common faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world?

I believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith.

We believe and trust in one God,
Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Those to be baptised have water poured over then three times. After a prayer the Priest sprinkles the congregation with water from the font to remind them of their Baptism and the renewal of their commitment today. Those baptised return to the Altar with the Priest. As you are sprinkled it is traditional to make the sign of the cross. During the sprinkling we sing:

Now is eternal life, if risen with Christ we stand, in him to life reborn, and, held within his hand; no more we fear death's ancient dread, in Christ arisen from the dead!

Unfathomed love divine, reign thou within my heart; from thee nor depth nor height, nor life nor death can part; our life is hid in God with thee, now and through all eternity.

For God, the living God, stooped down to share our state; by death destroying death, Christ opened wide life's gate. He lives, who died; he reigns on high; who lives in him shall never die.

At the end of the hymn the Priest says

There is one Lord, one Faith, one Baptism: by one Spirit we are all Baptised into one Body.

We welcome you into the fellowship of faith; we are children of the same heavenly Father; we welcome you.

As the Altar is prepared we sing the hymn

The Priest continues praying that the Spirit may come upon the gifts and recalling the action of Jesus at the Last Supper

Christ is the bread of life:

when we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus, until you come in glory.

The Priest continues the prayer, at the end all respond **Amen.**
