Living in Hope in Holy Week



At the heart of our community of faith is the journey to the Cross and then the empty tomb of Easter Day. Jesus invites his friends and disciples to walk with him as he makes that journey. A journey like our lives which is full of joy and sorrow, moments of challenge and suffering, as well as love and care. Jesus walks with hope through this as we seek to live in that same hope. We are encouraged to simply be with him through those days and create the time and space to stand at the foot off the cross and gather at the tomb.

Each year we are invited to share that journey and reflect on what it means for us, as we share in the special services of Holy Week and Easter. Some will be aware how special and important the services are; for others it will be a new experience, and for some it will be something we need to re-engage with.

Perhaps we could all make that extra effort and commit ourselves to walk together from the joy of the Palm Procession to the discovery of the Risen Christ on Easter Day

We will be welcoming a guest preacher to help us reflect on this journey. On Monday Tuesday and Wednesday evening at 7pm there will be a Mass with hymns at St Mary's – at the end of which Revd Canon David Isaac will reflect with us on themes of the week.

At **St Mary's** from Maundy Thursday to Easter Day **Canon David Isaac will also be our preacher** and help us to reflect on the events we are sharing in and how they affect our lives today. St Faith's will have their own pattern for Maundy Thursday and Good Friday – and

then we will be together to celebrate the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday together at St Mary's at 8.30pm.

At our services we reflect on the events of the Last Supper – the washing of the disciples' feet; Jesus breaking bread and sharing the cup inviting us to do this in remembrance of him and then he asks us to 'watch and pray with him' in the Garden of Gethsemane till he is betrayed by Judas.

At St Faith's 6pm Eucharist of the Last Supper ending with a short watch and vigil of prayer

At St Mary's 7.30pm Eucharist of the Last Supper

Good Friday April 18th



Our churches are stripped and empty – our focus is on the Cross and all it stands for and means. We hear the reading of the events of the first Good Friday in John's Gospel; we reflect on the cross, pray at the foot of the cross and end in stillness receiving the Body of Christ

At St Mary's I lam Children and Young People gather to share



in activities and art and craft to reflect on the day – ending with Hot Cross Buns
