

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
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Jesus provides rich imagery and meaning when He says, "Abide in Me, and I in you" and "I am the vine; you are the branches" (John 15:4, 5).

Jesus spoke the words to His disciples in the Upper Room in the confusing, challenging days just prior to His arrest and crucifixion. His passion for keeping His own close to Him in the midst of trying times is evident in the vine imagery. John recorded these words for us, for today. These words call us to grow in faith in the One who calls us to abide in His life.

Abide means to dwell, to remain, to stay, to have one's abode, or to continue in a particular attitude or relationship. Abiding "in Christ" means that He is our dwelling place. We are grafted into His holy life when we come to faith in Him; we live in Christ now, and we live in Christ for eternity. Therefore, His life is our abiding place, and we live in relationship with Him.

These words from John 15 are alive for me because I live and work among the vines in my vineyard. The photos in this book, taken in my vineyard during different seasons and stages of growth, will show you the beauty I see. In these photos and through the words on these pages, you will grow—as I have—in understanding of His work for us and in us and through us.

The Vine—Jesus—speaks these profound images through the roots, the sap flow, the canes, the buds, the leaves, and the fruit. Meaningful imagery unfolds when we see the work of the vine on the branches and in the fruit. The narrative of the vine also shows, in rich Old Testament imagery, the

relationship between God the Father (the Vinedresser) and the Son (the Vine).

The branches receive the work of the vinedresser in order to be healthy and grow and bear much fruit. A grapevine's bearing fruit is the natural result of healthy branches on a healthy vine, and a Christian's bearing fruit is the natural result of abiding in Christ's holy life. His life keeps us, cleanses us, provides nutrients and water; His life gives life and promotes growth. Health means embracing ourselves and those around us as multifaceted, wonderfully created human beings, whose lives are precious to God, the one who breathed His life into our being. He calls us to live, to life; He calls us to grow.

Growing means change, and change can be challenging. Sometimes we endure a pruning when God calls us to recognize our sin and to change. We fight it, but in faith we cling to the promise of the Vine's life in us and our life in Him. We are grafted into Christ's life; we are rooted and grounded in Him. We are alive in the Vine, and He is alive in us.

My prayer is that the images and the words on these pages be for your encouragement and hope in the True Vine, as they have been for me. I invite you to step into my vineyard and journey with me into deeper faith and trust in Him through the vines.


As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me.


