



Yet wishing for something we should not have or wishing for something inappropriately at the expense of someone else is sinful. It's called "coveting." The Bible includes many stories of people who coveted. They wanted, and in many cases attempted to get, what was not rightly their own. Think of famous people from Bible times. You shall not covet your neighbor's house.



### The Tenth Commandment

You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.
