

Our Father Welcomes

In the media on almost any day you'll find variations on the "lost son" or "lost daughter" theme. Such stories will have headlines similar to these:

- Teen's Parents Throw Him Out of the House
- Girl Gets Pregnant to Punish Parents
- Teen Boys Arrested for Physically Abusing Mother and Father
- "Fights with My Parents Forced Me to Join a Gang"

To an outsider, your fights with your parents may seem mild by comparison. To you (and to your parents), family fights cause stress and pain. Left unresolved, anger leads to hate, and hurt feelings lead to resentment, suspicion, and mistrust.

Think of an unresolved argument you had with your parents. Who was responsible? If you answer honestly, you probably have to admit that you shared in the responsibility. You probably also shared in that miserable guilty feeling that hung on in the silence after the storm.

What would it take to resolve the argument and restore the relationship God intended for your family? You may be surprised to discover it will take only five words, but they're the hardest words in the English language to say. Although you would like to hear your parents say these words, the only person you can make say them is you, yourself. Try them on your parents and see what happens.

"I was wrong. I'm sorry."

The lost son in the story Jesus told said those words. As a result, his father killed the fattened calf and hosted a party. His father forgave him. The loving relationship between them was restored.

Jesus told the story to show us that our heavenly Father forgives us and welcomes us home when we confess our sins to Him and tell Him we are sorry. Parents, especially those who share with us our faith in God's love and forgiveness through Jesus, forgive our sins and welcome us home the same way.
