President Abdulla Yameen Abdul Gayoom, while speaking at the the event commemorating the conclusion of land reclamation in Malé Atoll's Thulusdhoo Island, has stated that serving the people is to ascertain needs and to deliver on those needs.

In his speech, the President stated that any development Maldives witnesses should be accepted as one for each and every individual and that all Maldivians should partake in such achievements.
