President decides to issue student | Parliament greenlights loans to all eligible students



President Dr. Mohamed Muizzu has declared that student loans will now be given to all eligible students seeking higher education opportunities. The announcement was made by Minister of Higher Education, Employment, and Skills Development Dr. Maryam Mariya during the public forum "Ahaa".

The opening of this year's student loan application process, initiated on February 29, marks the first such initiative under President Dr. Muizzu's administration. Initially scheduled to conclude on April 25, the application deadline was extended to May 2, providing further opportunities for aspiring students. Under this scheme, the government has allocated 500 loan opportunities spanning from diploma to PhD programs.

During the forum, Minister Mariya reiterated the government's commitment to simplifying the student loan process and addressing the challenges faced by students aspiring for higher education. She announced President Dr. Muizzu's decision to grant loans to all eligible students who apply in this round.

The loan scheme offers flexibility for students to pursue their studies in their preferred countries, focusing on fields deemed essential for the Maldives' development, such as construction, aviation, and agriculture, as outlined in the President's manifesto. Notably, this year's scheme includes provisions for students with disabilities, with the government pledging to cover additional expenses based on individual circumstances.

Furthermore, existing students and those enrolled in free degree programmes will also have access to the loan scheme to cover supplementary expenses. The ministry has allocated 370 opportunities for new entrants and 130 opportunities for existing students.

In cases where students face challenges completing their programmes unforeseen circumstances, top-up loans will be available, capped at USD 45,000, to support their continued education journey.

appointment of 8 ambassadors

The Parliament has officially endorsed appointed ambassadors and high commissioners nominated by President Dr. Mohamed Muizzu, subsequent to the approval of the Foreign Relations Committee.

However, the Foreign Relations Committee disclosed that two of the appointed delegates were not subjected to interviews due to inconsistencies in their court documents. Consequently, the Parliament refrained from casting votes for their approval. The individuals who were not approved are Dr. Fazeel Najeeb, appointed as Ambassador of the Maldives to China, and Shuineen Rasheed, designated as High Commissioner of the Maldives to Bangladesh.

The approval process was expedited by the Parliament in response to concerns raised by President Dr. Muizzu regarding delays in the approval process.

Expatriate issue to be resolved within 3 years, pledges government

Minister of Homeland Security and Technology Ali Ihusaan has assured issue of illegal expatriates residing in the Maldives will be solved within a three-year timeframe.

Speaking at the Aha forum, Minister Ihusaan responded to a citizen's query regarding this pressing concern, shedding light on the steps being taken to rectify the situation. He emphasised the need to accurately ascertain the total number of expatriates in the Maldives, a task that will be achieved through the collection of fingerprints from all foreign nationals within a year. This initiative will commence on May 2, starting in Himmafushi, Kaafu Atoll, and gradually expanding across the country.

Once the fingerprints are collected, they will be cross-referenced with existing work permit records to determine each individual's legal status and custodianship. Minister Ihusaan highlighted the complexity of transferring custody of expatriates, acknowledging the need for streamlined procedures in this regard. However, he assured that after the data collection process, efforts will be made to facilitate legal transfers within the established framework.

Furthermore, minister revealed expatriates found to be residing illegally will be given an opportunity to rectify their status by entering the system. He added failure to avail this opportunity will result in deportation, with those lacking proper identification documents being swiftly repatriated in collaboration with relevant embassies. Moreover, the government is actively enhancing information management systems to bolster border security and immigration control using modern technology.

Looking ahead, Minister Ihusaan underscored the anticipated rise in demand for unskilled laborers due to the government's ambitious development projects under President Dr. Mohamed Muizzu's leadership. Special emphasis will be placed on ensuring legal entry for such laborers, thereby contributing to resolving the expatriate-related challenges within the stipulated three-year timeframe, he added.

IsDB discusses Islamic finance in Maldives



The Islamic Development Bank Institute (IsDB) has held discussions on the development and promotion of Islamic finance in the Maldives.

The talks were held during Minister of Finance Mohamed Shafeeq's official visit to Saudi Arabia. Minister Shafeeq met with Acting Director General of IsDB Dr. Sami Al-Suwailem. The meeting discussed ways to cooperate between the Maldives and IsDB. They also discussed ways in which Islamic finance can help.

Minister Shafeeq is on a visit to attend the annual meeting of IsDB. During the visit, he met with the heads of various international financial institutions and held important discussions. These include the OPEC Fund, the Saudi Development Fund and the Islamic Development Bank. Minister Shafeeq was accompanied by Minister of Islamic Affairs Dr. Mohamed Shaheem Ali Saeed.

Fathimath Habeeba appointed as member of CSC

The Parliament has approved the decision to appoint Fathimath Habeeba as a member of the Civil Service Commission (CSC). During today's parliamentary session, the decision to appoint her as a member of the CSC received approval, garnering a total of 38 votes.

Fathimath Habeeba's nomination was successfully endorsed, granting her the position in the CSC. However, the nominee Abdul Haseeb Ismail did not receive approval from the parliamentarians.

Habeeba have served as the Director General of the Civil Service Training Institute since December 9, 2019. Her appointment comes following the conclusion of Fathimath Amira's tenure as a member of the CSC, leaving a vacancy in the commission.

The composition of the commission now includes five members, namely President Nasih, Vice President Ibrahim Rasheed, Member Mohamed Farusath, Member Fathimath Shareef, and the newly appointed Fathimath Habeeba.

Gov't disburses USD 55 million to fishermen to date



The government has disclosed that approximately USD 55 million has been disbursed to fishermen since President Dr. Mohamed Muizzu assumed office.

During a public forum 'Ahaa', Minister of Fisheries and Ocean Resources Ahmed Shiyam revealed that a significant backlog of payments was outstanding to fishermen when the current administration took charge. Minister Shiyam acknowledged the challenges in swiftly addressing these overdue payments, citing the country's economic circumstances.

Despite these challenges, Minister Shiyam emphasised the government's commitment

to expedite the disbursement process in alignment with the President's directives. He noted that concerted efforts were made to ensure fishermen received their payments before Ramadan.

Since assuming office, the government has disbursed a total of USD 55 million to fishermen, according to Minister Shiyam. However, he also highlighted that there is still an outstanding balance of USD 1.74 million owed to fishermen. Assuring ongoing efforts to settle this remaining amount, Minister Shiyam reiterated the government's dedication to fulfilling its financial obligations to the fishing community.

Despite their commendable efforts, the Indian team emerged victorious, clinching the gold medals after a hard-fought battle. Prior to reaching the finals, both Ismail Azmeen and Hassan Nazim displayed exceptional performance by defeating doubles pairs from Singapore and Bangladesh in earlier rounds.

In another highlight of the tournament, the Maldivian doubles pair of Aminath Widha and Aishath Nafha faced tough competition in the semifinals, ultimately conceding defeat to an Indian doubles team. Nevertheless, both players showcased their prowess by advancing to the quarter-finals, where they secured a victory over a pair from Sri Lanka. he Asian Carom Championship, marking its return after a decade-long hiatus, is scheduled to continue until May 1, 2024. Featuring the participation of over 100 players from seven Asian countries, including the Maldives, the championship has reignited enthusiasm among carom enthusiasts.

The tournament serves as a platform for players from India, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, the Maldives, Singapore, Malaysia, and South Korea to showcase their talent. Notably, four world champions are among the participants, adding to the competitive spirit of the event.
