President Dr Muizzu stresses the importance of raising children to embody nationalism, discipline, and uphold Islamic values



President Dr Mohamed Muizzu emphasised the importance of nurturing children to embrace Islamic principles, nationalism, and leadership, noting that the responsibility falls on everyone. He made these remarks in his address commemorating Children's Day celebrations today.

President Dr. Muizzu commended this significant development, emphasising the enduring resilience and bravery of the Palestinian people. The Maldives reaffirmed its steadfast commitment to supporting the aspirations of Palestine for sovereignty and independence, echoing the sentiment shared by many nations.

In his statement, President Muizzu reiterated

Maldives' unwavering advocacy for an independent Palestinian state with East Jerusalem as its capital, in accordance with the pre-1967 borders.

The resolution, co-sponsored by Maldives, secured an overwhelming majority with 143 votes in favor. Notably, Maldives denounced the misuse of veto power in the UN Security Council, further amplifying the global call for justice for Palestine amidst ongoing challenges.

As Palestine advances towards full membership in the UN, supported by nations like the Maldives, the international community stands united in championing the rights and aspirations of the Palestinian people on the world stage.

BCC displays Authentic Maldives products at Washington D.C

Business Center Corporation (BCC) has facilitated the sale of Maldivian local products in Washington, D.C., USA, through Authentic Maldives. Six products from Authentic Maldives are now displayed at the World Bank Headquarters,

BCC emphasised the importance of this initiative in showcasing Maldivian products to new markets worldwide, thereby enhancing their popularity and solidifying their position in the global market.

Moreover, Managing Director of BCC Ibrahim Ziyau expressed pride in facilitating opportunities for Maldivian creators, highlighting ongoing efforts to expand the reach of Maldivian products to other countries in the region. Furthermore, BCC disclosed that the opportunity to showcase products in Washington, D.C., was exclusively offered to Maldivian female entrepreneurs, recognising the importance of promoting their products on the global stage. Currently, Authentic Maldives products are also available at two airports in Japan, Kansai and Narita International Airport.

In addition to outlets in Male', Crossroads Maldives, Velana International Airport, and Gan International Airport, BCC is working to expand Authentic Maldives by opening new outlets. Plans are currently in motion to establish an outlet in Thoddoo in Alifu Alifu Atoll.

These outlets collectively offer over 5,000 local products from more than 300 local producers.

Agreements signed for purchase of 3MW solar power systems



Ministry of Climate Change, Environment and Energy has signed an agreement with JV Wisdom NEGO, with the goal of procuring the first 3MW systems to be installed under the Magey Solar Project. The agreement was signed by Minister Thoriq Ibrahim and Wang Tao. The installation of the systems under the project is also a part of the ministry's policy to increase the utilisation of clean energy, with the assistant of the Asian Development Bank (ADB).

This project aligns with President Dr. Mohamed Muizzu's unwavering commitment to transition from conventional to renewable energy sources, such that the required electricity generated from renewable sources is 33% by the end of his tenure. Aiming to achieve this overarching goal, Magey Solar Project was launched. The project intends to ensure the provision of electricity from renewable resources, reducing the electricity bills of households and encouraging individuals to utilise renewable resources, thereby benefitting the society and the economy as a whole. Under the project, plans have been made to install 10 MW solar power systems in several islands of the nation.

The agreement signed encompasses the purchase of 375 3KW systems and 375 5kW systems. The installation of these systems will ensure electricity provision to 750 households. Currently, the 65kW solar power systems installed within the nation generates only 5% of the required electricity.

The President officiates oath- Youth education vital for island taking and firearm presentation prosperity

Minister of Cities, Local Government, and Public Works Adam Shareef Umar has underscored the crucial role of educational progressions of the youth for the sustainable development of any island. These remarks were shared speaking to PSM news following his visit to Thulusdhoo in Kaafu Atoll as part of his official tour to four islands in Male' Atoll.

The centric aim of this tour was to attain in depth information about the current circumstances and challenges faced by island councils.

Moreover, Minister Adam Shareef acknowledged Thulusdhoo's significance within the atoll and expressed a commitment to substantially develop its services. He further noted ongoing efforts to strengthen councils, with appeals for access to natural resources to bolster their financial autonomy. Plans are currently underway to facilitate this provision through collaboration with relevant ministries.

Highlighting President Dr. Mohamed Muizzu's pledged developmental initiatives, Minister Adam Shareef expressed optimism among residents for future government endeavors. He also emphasied the importance of expanding health services in Thulusdhoo, which was once regarded as an educational hub in the Maldives.

Additionally, the Minister expressed hope for Thulusdhoo's revitalisation through future progressions, reaffirming the ministry's commitment to facilitating changes within President Dr. Muizzu's presidential tenure.



Project commences to address flooding in Male' City

The government has initiated an operation to address the issue of flooding during the rainy season, aiming to provide a temporary solution until roads are upgraded to modern standards.

The collaboration involves the Maldives National Defense Force (MNDF), Ministry of Construction and Infrastructure, and Road Development Corporation (RDC), focusing initially on the West Park area, which experiences significant flooding during the rainy season.

Speaking at the inaugural ceremony of the project, Minister of Construction and Infrastructure Dr. Abdulla Muththalib emphasised the temporary nature of this initiative, highlighting its importance in mitigating potential emergency situations. The project involves installing necessary drainage facilities in the West Park area, with plans to address flooding in other areas as well.

Moreover, efforts are currently underway to bring in drainage pumps

to alleviate water accumulation in Male' City, and upgrades to existing pumps on Ameenee road are also being pursued.

Furthermore, Minister of Cities, Local Government, and Public Works Adam Shareef Umar stressed the administration's commitment to reducing damage caused by rainfall amid rapid global climate change. This initiative aligns with President Muizzu's vision for national welfare.

Minister of Defense Mohamed Ghassan Maumoon also reiterated the government's priority to reconstruct roads while minimizing rain-related damage for residents.

Financial aid and temporary relocation facilities are provided to affected residents, with plans to develop roads to modern standards and upgrade Boduthakurufaanu road with Chinese assistance. Tarring roads in Male' City are also slated for practical initiation by the year's end.
