President Dr Muizzu calls for international financial architecture reforms to help SIDS reach SDGs

President H.E. Dr Mohamed Muizzu called for financial architecture reforms and avenues for partnerships for Small Island Developing States (SIDS) to enable easier access to finance to reach the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). He made the remarks in his keynote address at the High-Level Meeting on Resource Mobilization for SIDS at the Fourth International Conference on SIDS (SID4) held in Antigua and Barbuda.

The President remarked that numerous SIDS, including the Maldives, that have graduated from the Least Developed Countries (LDC) category pay a hefty price tag, considering the increase in the cost of borrowing from bilateral creditors and restrictions on access to affordable finance.

Despite commitments made by the international community to augment development and climate financing for SIDS, President Dr Muizzu noted with concern that the net external resource inflow to SIDS has been on a declining trajectory over the past two decades. The President added that SIDS should not have to make impossible choices, such as deciding between funding the establishment of a new school and constructing seawalls.

The President called upon Multilateral Development Banks (MDBs) and international financial institutions (IFIs) to help enact reforms such as channelling funds through international capital markets given their positive credit ratings and, in turn, lend to SIDS at highly concessional rates and fulfil the promises made to SIDS in the last three decades. He then proposed that the development partners of SIDS partner with the MDBs and the private sector to scale up private finance flows to SIDS. The President also urged SIDS to broaden their vision and aim higher by identifying goals and seeking assistance and support from development partners.

In his statement, the President challenged the commitment and will to direct finance towards where and who needs it the most and urged development partners to stop viewing SIDS as mere recipients of aid and instead view us as partners in sustainable development.

Minister Zameer calls for stronger public-private partnerships to drive transformational change in SIDS



The Minister of Foreign Affairs, Moosa Zameer, today delivered remarks at the Private Sector Roundtable during the Fourth International Conference on Small Island Developing States (SIDS) held in Antigua and Barbuda.

In his address, Foreign Minister Zameer described public-private partnerships as a compelling framework for collaboration, as they involve pooling together resources and expertise, reducing risk significantly. He stated that through genuine partnerships, governments and businesses can deliver essential services and develop infrastructure in various sectors including healthcare, education, transportation, and energy.

Drawing on his experience in the private sector, Minister Zameer urged the private sector to engage more actively with SIDS. He noted that private sector investment has the potential to catalyse transformative change. He called on governments to create an enabling environment for businesses to invest in SIDS, through robust policies and economic diversification. He also called on the international community to support boosting the state and productive capacities of SIDS, which would enable SIDS to mobilise resources and attract investment.

The Private Sector Roundtable, organized by the United Nations Office of the High Representative for the Least Developed Countries, Landlocked Developing Countries and Small Island Developing States (UN OHRLLS), gathered leaders from governments, the private sector and civil society to discuss the importance of partnerships towards the implementation of the Antigua and Barbuda Agenda for SIDS. The Roundtable also showcased the outcomes of the SIDS Global Business Network Forum, which was held from 25-26 May 2024.

Abdul Raheem elected as Speaker of the Parliament

Parliamentarian Abdul Raheem Abdulla has been elected as the Speaker of the Parliament and Parliamentarian Ahmed Nazim has been elected as the Deputy Speaker of the Parliament. The Speaker and Deputy Speaker of the Parliament were elected during the first sitting of the new Parliament. The first sitting was presided by Parliamentarian Ahmed Siyam.

An interim committee has been established to elect a Speaker and a Deputy Speaker of the Parliament. While the Parliament consists of five parties; People's National Congress Party (PNC) which is the ruling part, Maldivian Democratic Party (MDP) which is the opposition party, Jumhooree Party (JP), Maldives Development Alliance (MDA) and Maldives National Party (MNP), the committee comprises of members from each party. Members of the committee and their respective parties are as follows: Ibrahim Didi (PNC), Abdul Gafoor Moosa (MDP), Gasim Ibrahim (JP), Mohamed Nazim (MNP) and Mohamed Abbas (MDA).

In addition to Abdul Raheem, Parliamentarian Ibrahim Nazil was also nominated as the Speaker of the Parliament. However, he obtained only 14 votes.

The Speaker and Vice-Speaker of Parliament are elected by secret election held among the members of the Parliament. Abdul Raheem successfully secured the title of the Speaker of the Parliament with 71 votes.

Following the elections of Abdul Raheem as the Speaker of the Parliament, the upcoming sittings of the Parliament will be presided by him. Deputy Speaker of the Parliament will only preside the sitting in situations in which mark the absence of the Speaker.

The President urges Governments to forge stronger partnerships with private entities and foster an environment conducive to increased private-sector investment

President H.E. Dr Mohamed Muizzu urged Governments to forge stronger partnerships with private entities, and foster an environment conducive to increased private-sector investment. He made these remarks at the Maldives Side Event, "The Pivotal Role of Private Sector Financing for Climate Resilience in SIDS," organised by the Ministry of Climate Change, Environment and Energy, at the Fourth International Conference on Small Island Developing States (SIDS4).

The President articulated that economic diversification called for a fundamental re-evaluation of business practices. He stated that Governments must forge stronger partnerships with private entities, fostering an environment conducive to increased private-sector investment. He highlighted the private sector's indispensable expertise, innovation, and capacity in the collective efforts for development.

President Dr Muizzu stated that the Maldives is shifting towards economic diversification. He further added that investments in infrastructure such as airports, healthcare facilities,

communication, real estate, and transshipment ports are pivotal in this endeavour, emphasising that these investments catalyse economic growth and advance human development.

The President cited the development of 'Ras Malé' with state-of-the-art sustainable and climate-resilient features. He noted that Ras Malé aims to address the housing crisis, open doors to economic prosperity, and represent the Maldives' commitment to sustainable urban living and inclusive development.

President Dr Muizzu additionally disclosed that to reduce reliance on food imports and enhance food security, the Maldives is actively pursuing avenues to introduce cutting-edge technology to bolster food production and is committed to establishing an agricultural industrial park.

Concluding the statement, the President urged the international community to join the development journey, offering accessible and adaptable solutions that recognise the distinct challenges and meet our pressing development needs.

Health minister addresses climate-related health disasters

President Dr. Muizzu further underlined the Administration's commitment to introducing new digital services that will benefit all residents of the Maldives. He expressed the Administration's intention to demonstrate to the international community, the results of the Maldives' resilience and strong determination that despite the challenges constantly faced, it is possible to overcome them and bridge the limitations.

"We have navigated treacherous currents, faced tempests of doubt, and charted our course through uncharted waters. But it is in our vulnerability—the soft sands of our limitations—that resilience takes root. Just as an island withstands the relentless tides, we too must rise above self-imposed boundaries," the President concluded.

New parliament : Public hope rises with gov't supermajority

The legislative authority is widely regarded as the most closely linked with the people, given its representation of public opinions and standpoints through elected officials from various constituencies.

In the recent parliamentary elections, the new parliament has set a record with 93 members representing different constituencies, an increase from the previous parliament's 87 members. This addition reflects a growing engagement with diverse public perspectives, as each member represents approximately 5,000 people in relation to the Maldives' population.

The ruling party, People's National Congress (PNC), has secured a super majority in the new parliament, winning 66 seats. Additionally, nine of the eleven independent candidates who contested the elections have joined PNC, bringing the total number of PNC representatives to 75. This majority further signifies substantial support for PNC's policies and governance.

Three other parties allied with PNC, Jumhooree Party, Maldives National Party (MNP), and Maldives Development Alliance (MDA) also secured seats without contesting against PNC candidates, resulting in a unified vision among 78 members of the new parliament.

Moreover, President Dr. Mohamed Muizzu highlighted this record-breaking result as a testament to the people's trust in the current administration and their commitment to the nation's substantial progress. The Maldives Democratic Party (MDP), which previously held a super majority with 65 seats, faced a significant loss, securing only 12 seats in the new parliament. Additionally, two members will serve independently.

The people place significant trust in the parliament, believing that decisions will be made in their favor and that the government will be held accountable. They expect their elected representatives to cooperate fully in providing necessary services and ensuring that governance benefits the nation as a whole.

For SIDS to achieve the SDGs, access to affordable finance is a question of justice, says the President



President Dr Mohamed Muizzu stated today that access to affordable finance is a question of justice for Small Island Developing States (SIDS) to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), in his opening remarks as Co-Chair at the Interactive Dialogue "Revitalizing SIDS' Economies for Accelerated and Sustainable Growth" of the Fourth International Conference on Small Island Developing States (SIDS4) in Antigua and Barbuda.



The President highlighted the obstacles SIDS face, including external shocks, climate change impacts, inadequate financing, and unsustainable debt. He commended the resilience of SIDS despite these challenges, showcasing their ability to thrive amidst adversity. He remarked that the COVID-19 pandemic served as a stark reminder of the vulnerability of SIDS economies to external shocks.

President Dr Muizzu noted the need for accelerated and sustainable growth for SIDS to transition to middle-income status and develop

further. Stressing the importance of building productive and state capacity, he underscored the critical need to build human capital and mobilise resources. The President underlined the need for capacity building, partnerships, advocacy, and strategic planning, highlighting the experience of the Maldives efforts towards disaster preparedness and its success in sustainable tourism.

The President further noted financing as a central challenge for SIDS, reiterating the need for affordable and accessible financing for development and stating that 'access to affordable finance is a question of justice' for SIDS.


