CNTY, Maldives explore renewable energy options



China Tianying Inc. (CNTY) has held discussions with the Maldives on investment opportunities in the renewable energy sector of the Maldives.

The discussions were held during a visit by Maldivian ministers to China, which includes Minister of Foreign Affairs Moosa Zameer, Minister of Finance Dr. Mohamed Shafeeq, and Minister of Construction and Infrastructure Dr. Abdulla Muththalib. The team is on an official visit to China from July 20 to 24.

The Maldivian Ministers are visiting China at the invitation of Minister of Foreign Affairs of China Wang Yi. During their visit, they will meet with Wang Yi and other senior Chinese officials, as well as representatives from key Chinese companies involved in the Maldivian economy.

New lightning detection systems launched

The Ministry of Climate Change, Environment and Energy has launched a new lightning detection system designed to detect and report lightning instantly.

The Ministry said that the system was installed by the Institute of Electrical Engineering, part of the Chinese Academy of Science, in collaboration with the Maldives Meteorological Service (MMS). It marks the first time such an instantaneous lightning detection and information system has been set up in the Maldives, with long-range lightning detection sensors installed at Velana International Airport (VIA) and Gan International Airport (GIA).

The Ministry said that the system will be integrated with a regional network to detect lightning and thunderstorms both within the Maldives and in surrounding areas. As such, it said that short-range lightning detection equipment will be installed to enhance monitoring capabilities.

The Ministry highlighted that lightning often damages electrical, electronics, and communication equipment and can sometimes cause accidents resulting in loss of life, property, and other assets. Air and sea traffic safety and security are also impacted. As such, the new lightning detection network will differentiate between different stages of lightning and identify the direction of associated storms, thereby improving forecasting accuracy and early warning systems.

The system will significantly enhance the accuracy of weather alerts (SIGMET) and forecasts (TREND) issued in accordance with International Civil Aviation standards and the Maldives Civil Aviation Regulation No. 3, ensuring greater safety and security for air traffic.



Maldives, Saudi Arabia discuss developing Arabic Language Institution

The Maldives and Saudi Arabia held discussions to establish an institution focusing on Arabic language.

It was initiated by Imam Mohammad Ibn Saud Islamic University (IMSIU), a university situated in Saudi Arabia and is to be titled Arabic Language Institute.

The University expressed its interest in establishing an institution and held important discussions with the Ministry of Higher Education, Labour and Skills Development. The meeting was attended by the Minister of State for Higher Education, Labour and Skills Development Dr. Abdulla Nazeer, and key representatives from the University.

During the meeting, the Ministry provided information on registering the Institution and provided insight on the courses which are accredited by the Maldives Qualification Authority (MQA). Both parties noted that the establishment of the institution would enhance the existing bilateral ties between the Maldives and Saudi Arabia.

Furthermore, the Ministry highlighted that the development of such an institution will promote Arabic as a language amongst local students. It disclosed that this was also a golden opportunity for foreign students interested in learning Arabic.

President decides on important measures to address the issue of illegal immigrants in Maldives



President Dr Mohamed Muizzu has decided on important measures to address the issue of illegal immigrants in Maldives, following recommendations from the Cabinet. This decision followed a comprehensive discussion on a proposal submitted by the Ministery of Homeland Security and Technology during a Cabinet meeting held on Sunday.

Following comprehensive discussions with the Cabinet on illegal immigrants in the Maldives, measures were reviewed for expatriates across inhabited, resort, industrial, and agricultural islands. Steps include implementing 10 fingerprint scans and facial recognition for identification, alongside programs for regularization and Assisted Voluntary Return (AVR) for those opting to return home voluntarily.

The Cabinet has also resolved to strengthen

the enforcement system to address illegal immigration in the Maldives. This includes establishing and publicly disclosing a list of companies that neglect their responsibilities towards migrant workers upon arrival, enforcing penalties for employer non-compliance, and taking further action if these issues recur.

The Cabinet has also decided to conduct audits and pursue strict legal action against illegal immigrants in the Maldives. This is intended to eliminate obstacles to employment opportunities for Maldivian youth, which are caused by the presence of illegal migrant workers.

The Cabinet also decided to place amendments to the Maldives Employment Act (2/2008) in the Parliament at the earliest to provide a permanent solution to the problem of illegal immigrants in the maldives.

MPS commences 37th Basic Training Course

The 37th round of basic training course for newly recruited police officers of the Maldives Police Service (MPS) has commenced at the National College of Policing and Law Enforcement.

Assistant Commissioner of Police Ahmed Abdul Rahman attended the inauguration ceremony.

Speaking at the ceremony, Assistant Commissioner Abdul Rahman urged all the newly recruits to work hard to achieve good results and complete the course.

A total of 48 female officers and 151 male

officers will undertake the training course. MPS stated that the course will cover physical training, operational safety and tactics, laws and regulations as well as sections related to police services.

The course is designed to provide the training and education required for the police job and to provide the relevant knowledge, skills, and experience required for the work of the police.

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Crackdown on undocumented migrants intensifies



Maldives Immigration has reported that the agency has intensified their efforts to combat undocumented migration.

Authorities have intensfied their efforts, searching 153 locations and deporting over 2,000 undocumented migrants from November 2023 to July 2024.

The latest data released by Immigration reveals that many foreigners are involved in prostitution, drug-related activities, gang fights, and black-market foreign exchange transactions. As per the data, authorities deported eight individuals involved in black market foreign exchange, 65 involved in prostitution, 141 involved in drug and gang-related crimes, 15 wanted in various cases, and nine with altered visas and documents.



An additional 1,289 foreigners attempting to enter and work in the country on tourist visas were intercepted and deported. A total of 341 foreigners from 22 countries were prevented from entering with forged work permits and visas.

Immigration has launched an online platform called Immigration Watch to report illegal immigrants and urges the public to report any such cases immediately. The government plans to expand the operation to all the islands by next year and aims to consolidate information on all foreigners in the Maldives into a single database, providing a comprehensive solution to the issue within three years.

LGA Chief calls on political parties' input on decentralization measures

Local Government Authority (LGA) Chief Executive Officer Dr. Maryam Zulfa has called on political parties to put forth their input into the proposed changes to the decentralization system initiatied by the President.

President Dr. Mohamed Muizzu recently proposed reforms to the decentralisation system, suggesting a reduction in the number of councillors to improve service delivery. He cited that the current system is overly complex and inefficient due to the large size of the councils.

The President recommended electing three councillors for populations under 3,000, consisting of a council president, a women's representative, and a youth representative. For populations between 3,000 and 10,000, he recommended electing five councillors.

In support of President Dr. Muizzu's proposal, Dr. Zulfa stated that the suggested changes to the councils and the decentralisation Act were not unprecedented. She emphasised that the formula recommended by President Muizzu represents the most effective approach to decentralisation, stressing the importance of incorporating the views of political parties in shaping the system.

As such, she said that discussions with all political parties will be conducted. The Ministry of Cities, Local Government, and Public Works is currently conducting studies to inform potential adjustments to the decentralisation system.

Dr. Zulfa also highlighted that the Maldives has previously collaborated with the International Republican Institute (IRI), affiliated with the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), during the initial introduction and strengthening of the decentralisation system. She said the changes will be reviewed with the Speaker and Deputy Speaker of Parliament, and a parliamentary committee.
