

2023 PBR World Finals: Unleash The Beast Dickies Arena – Fort Worth, Texas Sunday, May 21 at 1:45 p.m. CDT

RAFAEL JOSE DE BRITO LEADS AFTER 6 – Rookie Rafael Jose de Brito leads the 2023 PBR World Finals in Fort Worth, Texas, after topping Short Circuit for 88.5 points and tying for second place in Round 6. The Texas Rattlers star has the chance to make history in Fort Worth as the first rookie to be crowned the PBR World Champion should he be able to hold off the field on championship Sunday. Brito, who currently sits No. 5 in the Unleash The Beast standings, 244 points behind No. 1 Kaique Pacheco, has led the Rookie of the Year race since he overtook Daniel Keeping, winning his first career premier series event in Eugene, Oregon, on February 18. He currently holds a 276.5-point lead in the Rookie standings over fellow Brazilian Wingson Henrique da Silva, who sits in third at the World Finals. Both have the chance to become not only the first rookie to win a gold buckle, but also just the fourth rookie in history to win Rookie of the Year and the PBR World Finals in the same year, behind Boudreaux Campbell in 2020, Jose Vitor Leme in 2017 and Luke Snyder in 2001. Brito faces Red Mosquito in Round 7, while Silva takes on Ivy League.

DYNAMIC DENER WINS ROUND 6 – Barbosa danced in perfect time with Hard Candy to win Round 6 with a score of 90 points at the PBR World Finals in Fort Worth, Texas, the fourth 90-point ride of the two-week marathon. His ride and round win netted him 89 points and he currently sits No. 4 in the Unleash the Beast standings, 229.17 points behind Pacheco. The Brazilian cowboy entered the 2023 World Finals on a four-out ride streak, the longest of any rider heading into Fort Worth, after finishing second in Tacoma, Washington, and first in Louisville, Kentucky, to end the regular season. Barbosa continues his quest for his first gold buckle on I'm Legit Too in Round 7.

A PERFECT PAIRING – In Round 6, Eduardo Aparecido topped Chiseled for the fourth consecutive time, making the 8 for 87.75 points atop the bovine competitor. The ride finally put Aparecido on the board at the World Finals, securing him 36 points with for his fifth-place finish. In the first three meetings with Chiseled, the Brazilian cowboy managed to post three 90-point rides: 91.5 points in Allen, Texas, in 2019, 91.25 points in Las Vegas in 2019, and finally for 90.5 points in Lincoln, Nebraska, in 2020. Entering the World Finals, Aparecido was one of the hottest bull riders on tour, placing in the Top 15 in the last five events of the regular season including winning in Everett, Washington, and added on a second-place finish in the 15/15 Bucking Battle in Sioux Falls, South Dakota. Aparecido looks to finish the year on a new streak to contend for his first gold buckle, taking on Tulsa Time in Round 7.

HOT TAKES - Ahead of Round 7 of the 2023 PBR World Finals: Unleash The Beast in Fort Worth, Texas, here are a few other storylines to note:

Still In the Hunt: While No. 1 Kaique Pacheco still sits atop the standings with a 40-point lead over No. 2 Jose Vitor Leme, championship Sunday will most likely decide the 2023 PBR World Champion with 560 points going to the event winner and so many different riders still pushing for that coveted gold buckle. Should almost any rider in the Top 20 win the event, they would be able to overtake Pacheco and, if they are able to stave off the rest of the field when the dirt settles, take home the title at Dickies Arena.

FAMILIAR WATERS – Round 7 of the PBR World Finals will feature ten rematches. Those rematches are:

- Austin Richardson will look to solve Kid Knapper for the first time in his career after the animal athlete bucked him off first in 2.57 seconds in Sioux Falls in 2022, and most recently in Eugene, Oregon, in 6.88 seconds this past February.
- Boudreaux Campbell and Cold Creek have a long history, as the two have gone head-to-head four times. The Texas cowboy was bucked off in the first two meetings, first in 2.56 seconds in Las Vegas in 2021 and then in 4.62 seconds in Chicago, Illinois, in this past January. In Sacramento in February, Campbell finally made it to the bell for 85 points, but he was bucked off in 3.24 seconds in Tulsa, Oklahoma, later that month.
- Dener Barbosa has enjoyed sharing a chute with I'm Legit Too, who he has ridden in four of the pair's five outs. He first stood tall atop the bovine competitor in Las Vegas in November of 2018 for 87 points, then followed that up three years later with a 90.5-point ride in Okeechobee, Florida. I'm Legit Too got one back in Albuquerque, New Mexico, last year, bucking off the Brazilian in 5.27 seconds, but Barbosa bounced back and covered him for 90 points in Little Rock, Arkansas, earlier this year. In the pair's last meeting in Louisville, Kentucky, in April, Barbosa once again made the 8, this time for 89.5 points.
- Eduardo Aparecido rode Tulsa Time for 90.5 points in the pair's only previous meeting earlier in January.
- Jesse Petri takes on Bandito Bug for the second time after the bull got the better of him in 2.5 seconds in Albuquerque, New Mexico.
- Jose Vitor Leme runs it back against JAG Metals Grand Theft, who bucked him off in April of 2022 in 7.13 seconds after the two-time World Champion rode him for 92 points in Milwaukee that February.
- Marcus Mast seeks revenge on Cliff Hanger after he was bucked off in 3.39 seconds in July of 2022 in Big Sky, Montana.
- Silvano Alves looks for a repeat performance atop Moonlight Party, who he covered for 91.5 points the last time the pair shared a chute in Las Vegas in 2021. In their first meeting, the bovine competitor bested the three-time World Champion in 2.97 seconds.
- Tate Pollmeier looks to last the 8 atop Pearl's Ghost for the first time after being bucked off by the animal athlete in 1.64 seconds in Billings, Montana, in April.
- Wingson Henrique da Silva tries to remain perfect on Ivy League, who he danced with for 89.5 points in Milwaukee in March.

BULL PEN: ONE LAST OUT — Round 7 and the championship round of the 2023 PBR World Finals will feature the third of three outs for the bulls contending for the 2023 YETI PBR World Champion Bull honor. The 2023 YETI PBR World Champion Bull will be the animal with the highest average bull score from his six highest-scored outs logged during the 2022 PBR Team Series and 2023 Unleash The Beast regular season, and two outs at the 2023 PBR World Finals. The top bucking bulls competing at the World Finals will receive three outs, and World Champion contenders will be able to drop their lowest score in Fort Worth.

Ridin' Solo currently sits atop the standings boasting an average of 45.7 points, .7 points ahead of UTZ BesTex Legend in the No. 2 spot. Solo has been completely dominant at this year's World Finals, bucking off Dener Barbosa in Round 2 in 5.9 seconds for 46 points and following that up by bucking off Chase Outlaw in 3.54 seconds for an event-high 46.5 points, and he sits awaiting a chute partner in the championship round after Round 7. While not quite as dominant, Legend has been close on the 2022 YETI PBR World Champion Bull's hooves, as he bucked off Wingson Henrique da Silva in 4.00 seconds in Round 2 and Aaron Williams in 1.56 seconds in Round 4, both for 46 points to propel him up the leaderboard. He is set to buck second in the championship round.

In third sits Flapjack, boasting a 45.53-point World Average and bucking to become the first bull to win both and ABBI Championship and become a PBR World Champion Bull in the same year. Unflappable all season, the bovine competitor began his World Finals by shedding Lucas Divino in 1.51 seconds in Round 1 for 44.75 points before he bucked off Josh Frost in 4.08

seconds in Round 2 for 46.25 points, the best bull score of that round. Flapjack will buck last in the championship round. Cool Whip, who has bucked off all 20 cowboys he has faced this season, sits in fourth. Leading the standings for more than a month heading into World Finals, the animal athlete has been an enigma to riders all season. He bucked off Boudreaux Campbell in Round 2 for 42.75 points before ejecting Tyler Manor in Round 4 in 3.15 seconds for 44 points. Sitting at 45.45 points, Cool Whip will need a massive showing in Round 7 to come back and claim the top spot, as he faces Koltin Hevalow.

TELEVISION BROADCAST – CBS Sports Network will air every round of the 2023 PBR World Finals: Unleash The Beast LIVE, concluding with Round 7 and the championship round LIVE on Sunday, May 21, at 3:00 p.m. EDT.

Veteran broadcaster Craig Hummer will deliver play-by-play, with two-time PBR World Champion Justin McBride providing color commentary and Kate Harrison reporting from the dirt. Pre-show coverage will also feature veteran bullfighter Cody Webster and former PBR Livestock Director, PBR co-founder and Texas Rattlers Head Coach Cody Lambert.
