Progress Report

For the Period from JANAURY 2022 TO August 2022

Activities and Achievements of projects/programs

'UJJIVANA' (PHASE 3) : Promotion of anic farming

ACHIEVEMENTS:

- 61 volunteers are identified
- 71 members have participated in Gram sabha and raised issues on village road repair, repair of R O water plant, NREGA work, Street lights & Jantha houses.
- In 3 villages, village communities have identified local main issues and local resources to resolve them.
- 2 Farmers started carrying out village development activities and helping the needy people to get eligible govt schemes.
- 83 families accessed various govt schemes for economic empowerment.

- 4 farmers groups and 3 women SHGs are strengthened to work effectively.
- 3 new volunteers from 2 villages are identified.
- 14 volunteers are actively participating the project activities and helping the group members by giving awareness on various issues and helping the beneficiaries to apply for Govt schemes and get them.
- Taluk level 2 interaction meetings were held between Farmers and Govt officials and given awareness on various govt schemes and participants doubts are cleared.
- The volunteers have helped to 48 Group/SHG members and other people get the benefits by helping to apply for the eligible govt schemes.
- 16 farmers are sowing traditional seeds for their crop.

- 19 farmers adopted water management measures & 36 farmers adopted best soil management practices & 28 farmers adopted pest management measures under organic farming.
- 18 farmers practicing mixed cropping.
- 17 farmers practicing multi cropping.
- 15 farmers growing nutrition kitchen gardens.
- 35 farmer families sharing their resources (such as water, seeds, machineries, manure, knowledge) with one another.
- 35 farmers have gained knowledge and adopted good practices(Water, seeds, manutre, pest, soil) of organic farming.
- 83 farmers have gained more knowledge on how to reduce the loss after the harvesting the crops. As a result, 59 farmers are succeeded in reducing the losses.
- 60 members participated in Ward/Gram sabha and discussed on 8 issues related to village (Drinking water, NREGA work, Street lights, CC Road, Gutter, Individual Toilets, Soak pits & Cattle shed)
- During this period totally 83 members applied 129 applications, and out of which 124 applications were sanctioned and availed Govt schemes/services.
- 73 families have availed more than 1 Govt scheme this year.
- 83 members came forward to take up Income Generation activities as alternative livelihood options.
- 45 members have engaged in Income generation activities such as Dairy, Kirani shop, Goat rearing, Vegetable farming, Tailoring, Neem seed vending & Petty shop.

OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT :

- By the end of the funding period, 6500 local leaders in the target region have addressed local issues effectively. (By 2021, 650 emerged local leaders from 76 villages take up issues on Health and Environment benefitting 65000 families)
- By the end of the funding period, Gender Equality has improved in the target region. (By 2021, 80% of the families of 76 villages respect, uphold & practice Gender Equality by increasing the confidence level of 75% of women who voice out & report atrocities).
- Good Governance is practiced more often. (By 2021, 650 value based emerged leaders from among 76 villages participate, protect, uphold and practice good governance by availing government benefits/ entitlements and mobilizing resources, thereby increasing their economic status leading to self-reliance).

ACHIEVEMENTS:

Sangha management:

- Total savings during this reporting period is Rs.13,74,400/-
- 113 women have taken loan from Sanghas, 4 women from Bank and 19 from other sources.
- A total amount of Rs.17,66,000/- was taken as loan by members and Repaid a total sum of Rs.21,51,000/- during this period.
- 23 SHGs were graded to know their strength & weaknesses
- Internal auditing was conducted in 83 SHGs
- 13 SHGs have developed into self-managing sanghas.

Main achievements:

- 534 new families were reached during this period.
- 4 SHGs are registered at Registrar office and availed registration certificate.
- 42 families started growing Kitchen gardens.
- 186 families are started preparing and consuming nutrition food at home.
- 164 families practicing solid waste management at home.
- Health & Environment related 2 issues(Waste management & Hygiene in villages) are identified and tackled by SHGs and resolved with the help of Gram panchayath.
- 167 women participated in Gram sabha and discussed about the village issues.
- 12 women have contested in Gram Panchayath elections and 7 have successfully elected as GP members.
- 2 SHG members have availed membership in village level committees.
- 20 families adopted Rain water harvesting measures.
- 319 sapplings are planted near their houses and public places by SHG members.
- 87 families have started preparing nutrition food from locally available resources.
- 18 women have emerged as leaders are sangha and Federation level.
- 85 families have engaged in Income Generation activities.
- 4 Health checkup camps were conducted by women SHGs in collaboration with PHCs and other volunteer Hospitals. As a result, 464 people have undergone checkups for BP, Sugar, Heart/Kindney/Liver/Eye problems. Free medicines were given to minor diseases and major identified patients were referred higher treatment.

Achievements:

- Open house programs & Puppet show were conducted at 1 villages/schools with 390 participants.
- Through Outreach and 1098 helpline number, totally 424 cases received, and 253 children were counselled.
- Conducted 15 awareness programmes at various places and created awareness among 1708 people and through 156 outreach activities reached 5091 including students, youths, Govt service providers, general public & Villagers. The details are as follows:

SPARSHA – CAMPAIGN AGAINST CANCER

Activities / Achievements :

- 13 campaign volunteers are identified (11 Youths/women, 1 Priests & 1 Religious Sisters)
- 14 awareness programmes organized.
- 9 Cancer patients are identified.
- Donation of Rs.10,075/- is collected from community & people.
- Network with 9 schools, 8 colleges, 7 Hospitals, 32 women groups and 1 Likeminded NGOs is created.
- 12 Cancer affected families are counseled.
- 6 Cancer patients are referred for medication.
- In the villages where the awareness is created, some of the families have started adopting good food consuming habits to keep Cancer away.
- As a result of awareness created on causes of Cancer, the women in villages where awareness created, they have stopped burning plastic.
- The volunteers from different occupations are joining into the campaign and came forward to participate, co-operate and effectively reach to people through this campaign.
- The participants who attended the awareness / training programmes are decided to stop burning plastic as waster disposal or use it alongwith firewood for cooking.
- The women and youth who are aware that smoking is also a cause to Cancer, they have started creating awareness and encouraging their peers, family members and relatives to quit Smoking.
- The health staff have started creating awareness to people visit to PHC, on Cancer and related issues.

COVID CARE CENTRE AT BDDS, BALLARI
