

Vaccine Policy Statement

"Because we care about your child"

Vaccines are effective in preventing serious illness and in saving lives. Vaccines are safe.

All children and young adults should receive all of the recommended vaccines according to the schedule published by the

Centers for Disease Control and the American Academy of Pediatrics.

Based on all current scientific evidence, vaccines do not cause autism or other developmental disabilities. Thimerosal, a preservative that was in vaccines for decades, does not cause autism or other developmental disabilities.

Vaccinating children and young adults is the single most important health-promoting intervention <u>we</u> perform as health care providers, and that <u>you</u> can perform as parents and caregivers. The recommended vaccines and their schedule are the results of years and years of scientific study and data-gathering on millions of children by thousands of our brightest scientists and physicians.

As the percentage of unvaccinated children rises the risk of these terrible diseases to <u>all</u> children, even the vaccinated ones, also rises.

For all of these very important reasons it is an absolute requirement for ongoing care in our practice that your children be vaccinated on the recommended schedule.
