**CARMIYA WEINRAUB** is one of just a few Orthodox Jewish female comedians in North America. She has performed at Standup NY, UC Santa Barbara, and comedy clubs and synagogues nationwide. Her comedy's clean, but her house isn't. Carmiya was featured in the Washington Jewish Week (Dec 2021) for creating Interfaith Comedy, a unique approach to anti-bias work and a nationally-touring show, starring comedians from different religions. She has worked as a teacher, social worker and errand-avoider, all while raising 5 children.

**ROBYN SHRATER SEEMANN** is a multi-hyphenated theatre artist: writer-performer-producer. She is the founder and producing artistic director of Artists Circle, an all women's professional performing arts company dedicated to creating opportunities and breaking down barriers for Jewish women performing artists. Robyn delights audiences throughout the region with live storytelling performances, and as a writer and performer with Ask Your Local Orthodox Sketch Troupe (LOST), a Jewish women's sketch comedy troupe. Her award-winning plays have been produced at Adventure Theatre MTC, DMV Q Fest, and Baltimore Playwrights Festival. She is the host and writer of the Shattering The Single Story podcast, and loves to share her unique blend of writing and performing in her workshops on public speaking, storytelling, and improv.
