
## Altonsyde Cycle to Auldearn

Distance: 20km/12 miles

Duration: 3 hours depending on stops



## **Highlights**

Quiet country roads, farm lands, river side, Tales of The Witch of Auldearn, Boath Doocot, Wee Cake Shed in Kingsteps, Nairn Promenade

In order to stay off the busy A96, I went down Tradespark park and cycled parallel to the main road, until I came out onto the A96 at Fishertown

- •Cross the Nairn Bridge and indicate to turn right to get down to Nairn River
- •Follow the bike/footpath along the river, under the Nairn Viaduct (train) and then head towards Granny Barbour's Road
- You are now on a quiet road passing along a tree shrouded road, or between fields of hay, it is gorgeous
  At the B9101 junction turn left to head down to
- Auldearn
- At the 1645 pub you are now on Auldearn 'High Street'
- I then explored Auldearn
- •Visit the beautiful Church and Churchyard, the Mural of Isobel Gowdie the Witch of Auldearn (near the Rose Garden), Boath Doocot
- •Take care from Doocot lane, as you will cross the busy A96, to head down past Boath House
- •Heading for Kingsteps and Lochloy road
- •I cycled passed and did a double take, when I realised I had found another honesty cake shed, The Wee Cake Shed! It would have been rude not to stop, buy a traybake and a cappuccino and rest on the picnic bench
- •After refreshments, I headed back into Nairn, follow the waymarked cycle lane, just passed the Nairn Dunbar Golf Course
- •I crossed the Merryton Bridge across, down around Fishertown
- •I then cycled along the promenade, turned up at the Golf View Hotel, back along Altonburn Road and up

to Tradespark Road
