

## New Media Portfolio Website Design

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Recommended reading: **Adobe Dreamweaver CS4 How-Tos 100 Essential Techniques**, by David Karlins, Peachpit.

New Media Portfolio is a three credit introductory course in the study of computer graphics in design and execution of digital interactive and multimedia forms. Among other studio-based projects, you will create an interactive digital version of your portfolio. This course will give you the opportunity to compile your best pieces, write and speak professionally about your portfolio of work, and provide you with the basic technical skills needed to create a website.

### Class Structure

The class will meet for lectures, demonstrations, group critiques and discussions, and student presentations. Critiques will take place as scheduled on course calendar. You are expected to have work completed in time for the critique (late work will affect your grade). This forum serves to develop critical thinking and verbalization of both formal and conceptual concerns. There will be quizzes on the reading and technical information covered in class.

### Assignments

You will be required to produce two digital forms of your portfolio. There will be additional assignments, which will include readings. The assignments given are designed to expose you to the many different avenues of portfolio design, organization, presentation and programming. Each assignment is prefaced with a class discussion on the potential and possibilities open for exploration within the assignment.

### Grading

Your final grade is an average of the following:

80% critiques

10% quizzes

10% library assignments combined

A = work of exceptional quality

B = strong work

C = good work

D = poor work

F = work incomplete or of exceptionally poor quality

### Attendance

Attendance is mandatory. If more than three classes are missed or if partial attendance occurs (late arrivals or early departures) **your final grade will be lowered a letter grade per offence**. It is absolutely essential to attend class and be punctual, as to not miss important announcements and demonstrations. If you are late for a critique or do not have the completed assignment, you will be asked to not participate, and your grade will be lowered accordingly.
