UKRAINE AND CLIMATE ADVOCACY

Timothy Snyder asks, Why does the world need a Ukrainian victory?

He gives many answers, and climate is one of them:

"To accelerate the shift from fossil fuels. Putin shows the threat that hydrocarbon oligarchy poses to the future. His weaponization of energy supplies has accelerated the turn towards renewables. This will continue, if Russia loses."

Snyder offers 14 other reasons why Russia should lose, and he concludes:

"I am a historian of political atrocity, and for me personally number 1 -- defeating an ongoing genocidal project -- would be more than enough reason to want Ukrainian victory. But every single one of the other fourteen is hugely significant. Each presents the kind of opportunity that generations of policy planners wish for, but almost never get. Much has been done, we have not yet seen and seized the moment."

WHY CAN'T WE ACT?

The question isn't simple. Social critics like C. Wright Mills and Betty Friedan have emphasized the need to connect the dots, to make people see how "the personal is the political." It isn't easy to do:

"[About climate change] I ask myself why it took me so long to get motivated. Passivity may look the same as indifference, but it may not be that at all. For a long time, I felt lost in the complexity and political, moral, and emotional confusion of climate change. Finally connecting the problem with the lives of my family and friends made inaction seem out of the question..."

OLDER VOTERS & CLIMATE

Older voters, like all groups, are diverse. Some, like me, go toward Third Act, Elders Climate Action, and other advocacy efforts. But younger voters are crucial for climate advocacy, so intergenerational work may prove crucial in our climate crisis: "If the 2022 elections had been decided by voters 45 and older, then the Republicans would have won the House by a big margin and perhaps won the Senate, too. Younger voters were the key. As it turned out, the 18-to-29 age group in 2022 had the second-highest turnout in midterm elections in nearly three decades. In other words, younger voters, not older voters, made the difference in preserving democracy and safeguarding the Inflation Protection Act. In short, it was the young, not the old, who protected democracy as well as the biggest national climate initiative signed by President Biden, the oldest man ever to occupy the presidency."
