

## Friends of Crab Orchard Refuge Strategic Goals and Budget For 2024 By Rick Whitecotton

We have been struggling since COVID hit to establish a meaningful set of goals. We had goals, but they were not deep and were too simple. It has been a challenge to restart this process. We did it by organizing our Committee Chairs, writing some standard documents, and creating a few simple forms that aided in forecasting goals, expected outcomes, and needed budgets to support the work. So, it took a few months this year...we started work in January and completed it at our April meeting. I feel we will start earlier in 2025 and end with a set of goals and a budget one or two months earlier. It is a team process and sets us on a path to learn better how to operate year over year.

The goals I am listing are selected as representative of the overall goals. I have called them many things, but likely will settle on High Level Goals. They are as follows:

#### High Level Goals for Friends of Crab Orchard Refuge 2024

- 1. Review By-Laws
- 2. Eclipse Event
- 3. 6 Nature Dialogues
- 4. Photography Symposium
- 5. Increase Membership to 275 by year end
- 6. Increase sales by 15% over 2023-year end

These six goals have been chosen to represent the whole scope of work we are undertaking for 2024. Our standing committees each developed around 5 goals, some more than that. You see a review of the By-Laws, this is a major effort that will take many months to complete, this was developed by the Executive Committee.

The Eclipse Event likewise was touched on by many committees but recorded by the Executive Committee. The Nature Dialogues goal was written by the Interpretive and Outreach Committee. It serves as a direct contact to you the Friends members and the community at large. The Photography Symposium was a new goal written by the Photography Committee. The Membership goal is an increase of over 25 from last year's total membership and was developed by the Media, Marketing, and Membership Committee. Lastly you will see a goal to increase sales in the Gift Shop from our Merchandise Committee.

You are welcome to attend a committee meeting or get engaged with any that are of interest to you.

As I noted above this list is representative of a much larger set of goals. To accomplish our whole set of goals we developed a budget simultaneously. This is by far the largest budget we have ever put together. As I noted earlier, COVID has

hampered our ability to meet and develop any meaningful budget since 2020. This year, however, we have a decent budget. We recognize that we are likely to miss a few items, we will improve the work year over year.

Our budget request is: \$49,093.59. Our expected revenue is: \$64,450.

AS we are a nonprofit organization this means if all goes as planned, we will be able to provide more support for Crab Orchard next year! Most of the budget provides direct support for Refuge projects and events. We have no paid employees, and the bulk of our internal expenses are for mailing and office supplies. Our Gift Shop operation has a large budget, but it is our main source of revenue.

It was tough work to bring this together, but I am pleased to write this article and proud of our work.
