A View from My Perch January, 2024 By President Rick Whitecotton



Winter, hardly kind to old bodies, needful for nature's regeneration. I feel I have been droning on for a few years now on the positive change that will happen once our Visitor's Center opened. It opened in 2023 and I will recount some of the positive outcomes we are seeing so far, and project

some near term opportunities.

One outcome I was looking for was a place to call our home, the home for the Friends a location to meet, discuss, work thorough plans and so on. Done! We have already held many meetings in the small conference room and several monthly Board meetings in the multi-purpose room. There have been several community nature focused sessions from youth duck hunters to nature related groups that have used the facility.

Some immediate results the Friends have seen are that we have reformed our Strategy and Planning Committee into an Executive Board. The five officers meet monthly to plan and adjust our course...this is making a difference. We have been frustrated for the past 3 years due to the inability to meet for committee work for a variety of reasons. Resolved! This provides a space for our committees to meet on the property, which is far more focused. Thus, it helps our committees to function better.

The newly renamed Interpretation and Outreach Committee (formerly Education Committee) chaired by Kathy Belletire has a schedule of "Nature Dialogues". This is the next evolution in the old nature training sessions we held 4 years ago. We are currently planning a diverse set of nature focused training events on 6 Sundays through the year. This is an opportunity to meet fellow Friends and other neighbors in our communities that share our love of nature. Our first one is Sunday, January 14. Please see the accompanying article and drop by to participate (you must sign up in advance to be assured of a seat). They are to be held in the Multi-purpose room.

It will be 2 full years to see a completed display in the display room. There is roughly 2,700 square feet of floor space to fill! In the interim, our Photography group and the Interpretation and Outreach Committee are using the space for photography exhibits and art exhibits. Please come by frequently to see new displays as they appear.

We finally have the space to hold a formal photography contest again. You will find that information in this edition also.

Perhaps I should have started by talking of the new Woodland Gift Shop. We have been in operation for several months in our new spaces, and our sales show what stability and display space can bring. We get shoppers from across the U.S. that take a moment to stop by, shop, and just pala-

ver with us. We help them to have a great visit to our Refuge.

We do not and cannot foresee all the possibilities offered by these new spaces. Come by and visit, check it all out!

2024 Photo Contest Rules

- Submissions are due by April 7, 2024 at the Crab Orchard national Wildlife Refuge Visitor's Center Friends Woodland Gift Shop located at 6987 Headquarters Road, Marion, IL.
- 2. Photos can be entered in the following categories (maximum of 2 photos/category): 1) Landscape/scenic; 2) Birds; 3) Other wildlife; 4) pollinators 5) flowers/plants/trees/fungi; or 6) on Crab Orchard National Wildlife Refuge; or 7) photos taken by youth. In addition, we are introducing a new annual theme category and this year's theme will be <u>Reflections</u>. All pictures must be taken south of I-64 in Illinois and must be taken on Federal or State Refuge, Park, or forestry Lands. Each category will be judged for first place, second place, or third place. Photos submitted by anyone 17 or younger will be judged separately.
- younger will be judged separately. **3.** Submissions must be the original photograph, minimal editing such as cropping is allowed. Photographs should be the work of the person submitting the image. All photographs must be amateurs.
- **4.** Ethical photography is expected and the photo's subject and environment should not be disturbed or manipulated for the sake of creating the image.
- 5. Photos should be submitted in person. Photos must be printed on photo quality paper oin 8 X 10 size. Photos should be matted with mattle board with a finished size no larger than 11 X 14. No glass, plastic, frames, or hangers, please. A completed entry form should be taped to the back. Entry forms are available at friendsofcrabor-chardrefuge.com and at the Visitor's Center.
- 6. The cost of submission is \$8/photo for adults and \$2/photo for youth. Friends of Crab orchard Refuge Members can submit at the reduced cost of \$5/photo adults or \$1/ photo for youth whose family is a member. Friends membership is open to the public
 - and can be purchased at the Visitor's Center Woodland Gift Shop.
- 7. Winners of the Photo Contest will be announced at the Photo Contest Reception at 2:00 on Sunday, April 21, 2024 at the Crab Orchard Refuge Visitor's Center for the next month.
- 8. Non-winning photos may be picked up after the reception. Photos not piked up by May 20th will become property of the Friends Of Crab orchard Refuge.

FRIENDS MANAGEMENT OF MEMORIAL FUNDS JANUARY 2024 BY RICK WHITECOTTON

FRIENDS, THIS IS A TOPIC YOU MAY RARELY CONSIDER. ONE OF THE ASPECTS OF THE FRIENDS OF CRAB ORCHARD REFUGE IS TO PROCESS MEMORIAL FUNDS. THE PROCESS STARTS OFTEN WITH THE YOUTH OF A PERSON WHO LOVES AN ASPECT OF NATURE, AND HAS EXPERIENCED NA-TURE IN A POSITIVE WAY AT OUR REFUGE. THEY HAVE SPENT SO MUCH TIME ON THE PROPERTY, THAT WHEN THAT SAD DAY OCCURS THAT THEY LEAVE THE MORTAL COIL...THOSE LOVED ONES WHO REMAIN WISH TO HONOR WHAT THEIR LOVED ONE TREASURED SO MUCH IN THEIR LIFE... THE REFUGE. THIS IS WHERE WE GET INVOLVED. WE CAN BE THE RECIPIENT OF SUCH FUNDS SET UP IN HONOR OF THE DEPARTED LOVED ONES. WE MUST WORK IN CONCERT WITH OUR PARTNERS IN THE FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE TO SET UP A RESTRICTED FUND THAT PROVIDES SUPPORT TO THE REFUGE. OUR CURRENT AGREED APPROACH IS THIS:

- 1. FIRST PURCHASE OUTDOOR FURNITURE.
- 2. SECOND PLANT A NATIVE TREE OR TREES.
- 3. DONATE TO A FUND UNDER THE CONTROL OF THE FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE FOR THE GOOD OF THE REFUGE.

ALL THESE ITEMS ARE TO SUPPORT NATURE, NATURE VIEWING, AND INTERACTION AND CAN RE-SULT IN NATURE INTERPRETATION PROGRAMS OR EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS EVEN. THE BEREAVED OR A FUNERAL HOME CONTACT EITHER THE FRIENDS OF CRAB ORCHARD REF-UGE OR THE FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE TO IDENTIFY THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A FUND. THE FRIENDS RECEIVE ALL FUNDS, RECOGNIZE THE RECEIPT OF DONATIONS TO THE DONOR AND RETAIN THE MONIES IN A RESTRICTED FUND. THAT FUND IS EARMARKED FOR ONE OF THE THREE CHOICES ABOVE AS AGREED UPON BY DISCUSSION WITH THE BEREAVED. HERE IS A STATUS OF MEMORIAL FUNDS WE HAVE PROCESSED OR ARE NEARLY COMPLETE CURRENTLY:

- BARNSTABLE MEMORIAL, RON HAMBERG MEMORIAL, AND CRAIG WISINSKI MEMORIAL COLLECTED A TOTAL OF \$2,611.51. THIS MONEY WAS TRANSFERRED TO A RESTRICT-ED ACCOUNT FOR THE PURCHASE OF OUTDOOR FURNITURE. A WEEK AGO, WE ORDERED A HANDICAP ACCESSIBLE PICNIC TABLE FROM BARCO WHICH DEALS IN DURABLE OUT-DOOR FURNITURE. THIS WILL FULFILL THE WHOLE FUND WHEN IT IS DELIVERED.
- AIMEE HEMPHILL MEMORIAL WAS FUNDED TO OVER \$1,600, WE HAVE THUS FAR PUR-CHASED AND PLANTED TWO WHITE OAK TREES WHICH ARE PLANTED IN THE MARTHA'S THEATRE AREA. THERE IS A REMNANT OF \$423.23 WHICH WILL GO TOWARD LABELING OF THESE TREES.
- THE KELLY MEMORIAL WAS SET UP UNDER DIFFERENT GUIDELINES, IT FUNDED 64 INDI-VIDUAL ANNUAL PASSES WHICH WERE DISTRIBUTED TO FAMILIES.

THESE FUNDS COME IN THEIR OWN TIME, AND ARE NEVER EASY TO DISCUSS. IT IS, HOWEVER, ONE OF THE SERVICES WE PROVIDE TO THE COMMUNITY AND OUR PARTNERS IN THE FISH AND WILDLIFE SERVICE.


Meet Our Newest Board Member Kathy Carstens


