Beginner Level Syllabus Overview

Student Level at Part 1 – *very* basic level. Student has little to no knowledge of the English language.

Course aim:

• To introduce student to all areas of basic English language.

Course includes:

- 1. Alphabet
- 2. Nouns
- 3. Pronouns and determiners
- 4. Infinitive verbs and present simple
- 5. Prepositions (location and direction)
- 6. The possessive adjectives
- 7. Demonstrative pronouns
- 8. Numbers
- 9. Prepositions (time and instrument)
- 10. Revision
- 11. Test
- 12. Test answers

Please note – Extra revision lessons and re-sit tests are available. Students who wish to progress to the next level (and receive the certificate), must pass the end of course test. Students who do not pass the test first time can re-sit as many times as they like.

By the end of course topic number 6, the student should:

- 1. Know the letters of the alphabet.
- 2. Know how to put together a *simple, short* grammatically correct sentence.

By the end of this course, the student should also:

- 1. Be familiar with the numbers.
- 2. Know how to describe the basic location of an object using prepositions.

HALF-WAY THROUGH BEGINNER LEVEL

Student Level at Part 2 - basic level but can get by. Student is familiar with half of the basic elements of the English language.

Course aims:

- To reinforce language learnt from Part 1.
- To introduce the student to the remaining areas of the *basic* English language not already covered in Part 1.

Course includes:

- 1. Question words
- 2. Present continuous
- 3. Past simple
- 4. Future
- 5. Negatives
- 6. Linkers
- 7. Adjectives
- 8. Adverbs
- 9. Modals
- 10. Revision
- 11. Test
- 12. Test answers

Please note - Extra revision lessons and re-sit tests are available. Students who wish to progress to the next level (and receive the certificate), must pass the end of course test. Students who do not pass the test first time can re-sit as many times as they like.

By the end of this course, student should be able to:

- 1. Form questions.
- 2. Use different verb forms.
- 3. Put longer sentences together.
- 4. Link sentences together.
- 5. Add basic descriptive language onto *simple* sentences that are as grammatically correct as possible.

END OF BEGINNER LEVEL

Lesson Structure

Lesson Length: 1 hour

- 1. Homework feedback (15 mins approx.)
- 2. **Speaking** (new target language) (20 mins approx.)
- 3. **Listening** (new target language) (20 mins approx.)
- **4.** Homework explanation **reading** and **writing** exercise (5 mins approx.)

Note:

- The above structure is a general guide but if a student needs more time to practice a specific skill, then the structure can be flexible.
- At this level, the aim of each lesson level is that the student can at least recognise the new target language and if possible, use each skill: speaking, reading etc.
- As a student makes progress, such as moving up a level, then the time spent on each skill will increase. This means that lessons may focus more on a specific skill, such as reading, rather than all the skills.
