

Recycling Drop-Off Instructions









General Drop-Off Rules

- 1. Remove all recyclables from bags.
- Place all recyclables in the appropriately marked section of the collection container.
 Do not place any items on top of the container or on the ground.
- 3. Please close doors when finished.



What Can You Recycle?

You may place the following items inside the recycling station:

- Newspaper
 (keep dry; inserts are OK; remove plastic sleeves and rubber bands)
- Cardboard & Paperboard
 (please flatten boxes; wide boxes may need cut up to fit into container)
- Magazines, Catalogs & Phone Books (keep dry)
- Office Paper, Junk Mail & Envelopes (keep dry; no paper clips or binders)
- Glass Bottles & Jars
 (clear, brown, & green; throw away lids;
 labels OK; rinse containers; no plate glass,
 ceramics, or light bulbs)
- Steel (tin) Cans
 (rinse cans; labels OK; no paint or aerosol cans; no gas canisters)
- Aluminum Cans (empty & flatten)
- #I (PET) & #2 (HDPE) Plastic Bottles (rinse bottles; labels OK; throw away lids; flatten if possible)

Please recycle <u>bottles</u> only! Such as soda and water bottles, milk jugs & detergent bottles

No motor oil bottles

Non-bottle containers <u>not</u> accepted, even if they have a #1 or #2 on them (e.g. ice cream buckets & butter tubs)
