We welcome Ampthill to Butts Park Arena today for our sixth league game against them during my time at Coventry.

We have had some great battles with them, and in the league alone we have only beaten them twice in that period, with a last minute loss away from home last January sticking in our memory.

They are one of a few sides that have significantly strengthened for this season, with some experienced Greene King IPA Championship players joining them and adding quality to their squad. They are also now settled into the league after ending last season with a top half finish, so they are no mugs and today will be another huge battle.

We have had an interesting couple of weeks. After losing Nic Dolly to Tigers and Suva Ma'asi to a shoulder injury within the same 24 hours we were pleased to get the five points away from home against a tough and talented Nottingham side. Unfortunately since then we have picked up a couple of injuries (most of them short term), and that combined with James Harper and Kieran Wilkinson being involved more with Sale has meant that we have added Tom Doughty (hooker) and Will Butt (centre/wing) to our squad, joining from Bath until the end of the season initially.

Tom had a great pre-season. He worked hard to accelerate his development and, on merit, was selected to start against Jersey in our first pre-season game. He then picked up an injury and has been back fit for a few weeks and trained well, stayed patient and again worked hard for a chance, so it is great to be able to reward him this week. Evan has really impressed us with his attitude to work and learn. He is a gifted athlete and very skilful so we are excited to see what he can do with his opportunity this weekend.

Over the next few weeks we are launching our Under-18 and Under-23 squads for the 2021/22 season with a series of talent ID days (more details on the website). We will also be announcing another great opportunity alongside Moulton College to add a great option for our Academy players going forward, so watch this space - but hugely exciting times!

I hope you enjoy the game and hopefully it won't be long before we can welcome you all back to the Butts.





TODAY'S OPPO AMPTHILL By John Butler



Our visitors to the Butts Park Arena today are Ampthill and District, and we extend to them, as always, a warm Coventry welcome.

Having won promotion to the Greene King IPA Championship for the first time in 2019/20, Ampthill have deservedly earned themselves a reputation of being difficult to defeat.

While Cov have been at the top end of English rugby for decades, Ampthill's rise to the second tier has come largely in the past few years. Indeed, as recently as 2008/09 they were playing in Midlands Division 2 (East), so the whole management of the club deserves plenty of credit for the ambition and then putting their plans in place.

The history of rugby being played in the Ampthill area can be traced back to 1881, while the club re-formed in 1950 after World War Two. The first acres were acquired at Dillingham Park in 1958, the current club, Ampthill & District Community Rugby Football Club being incorporated in 1959.

The Mini/Junior section at Ampthill is well known to have thrived in a big way since its initial formation back in 1971 and continues in that vein as one of the largest clubs in Bedfordshire and a provider of plenty of talented players into Premiership Academies.

Our league meetings began in 2015/16 when they won promotion to National League One, whereas last season we met for the first time in the Championship, once again after Ampthill had won promotion. Overall, the record books show that our two clubs have only been meeting for some six seasons.

In terms of league clashes, there have been seven prior to today. Currently, Ampthill lead 4-3 in victories, all three of our successes having come here at Butts Park Arena.

All-bar-two of the previous league encounters have been relatively close. One exception is a 12-point winning margin secured by Ampthill in their 2017/18 home win.

But the other exception referred to here came at Butts Park Arena, also in 2017/18, when Cov triumphed 63-14, running up nine tries overall. Scrum-half Tom Kessell claimed a hat trick, with flanker Brett Daynes securing a brace.

With COVID-19 bringing last season to its premature close, we met just the once, Ampthill winning a close encounter, 17-19 at Dillingham Park. However Cov won both the Championship Cup meetings, which was the first time we had succeeded at Dillingham Park.

Mark Lavery has remained as Director of Rugby, while the vastly experienced former Welsh international fly half Paul Turner continues to head up the coaching team.

In common with most Championship sides, the Ampthill squad is much changed from last season. A name very well known to us from previous meetings though is open side flanker Joe Bercis, the side being captained from fly half by Louis Grimoldby, who is also the main goal kicker in the squad. Another familiar name we will probably come up against is Gloucester's dual registered full back Tom Hudson, who briefly trained here during the recent pre-season.

Ampthill were last in action on March 21st, when they defeated Nottingham 31-15 at home. Prior to that, the opening two games were both lost against the Championship's top two teams, 6-54 at Ealing Trailfinders and 17-19 at home to Doncaster Knights.

PLAYERS TO WATCH



New face MATT MARSH

Matt Marsh was Club and first team captain at Cardiff Met RFC, making 65 appearances in BUCS Super Rugby and scoring "more points than he can remember".

The 22-year-old joined Exeter Chiefs Academy while at school and spent a year in South Africa at the Stellenbosch Academy of Sport before going to University.

Matt made his Ampthill debut in the second preseason friendly and win against Bedford Blues and was a contender for Man of the Match in Ampthill's first Championship victory this year in the recent fixture with Nottingham.



Club stalwart JOE BERCIS

Twenty-six year-old flanker Joe Bercis rejoined Ampthill from Moseley in 2016 and has been an almost ever-present in the starting XV since.

Bercis has 161 first team appearances and 64 tries to-date, including five in the Greene King IPA Championship last season which earned him a place in the GKIPA Team of the Season!

Bercis is a Mob supporters' favourite and is the club ambassador for mental health partners blOKes!

TODAY'S OPPO FORM GUIDE



Director of Rugby, Mark Lavery described Ampthill's initial block of games as "an incredibly tough hand" with opening fixtures against two of the Greene King IPA Championship favourites, Doncaster at home and Ealing away, on the back of only five weeks training in Phase 3.

Round 1 saw Doncaster visit Dillingham Park, but with the two clubs "months apart" in their preparations nobody expected a repeat of last season's home win. However, despite outscoring the visitors by three tries to one, Ampthill undid themselves with an excessive error count and played long periods of the second half with only 13 players on the pitch! An in-form Sam Olver kicked four from four to inspire a 19-17 victory for the Knights.

When you are five weeks into Phase 3 training, it doesn't come much tougher than Ealing Trailfinders away. Ampthill were keen to avoid a repeat of last season's 77-26, 11 try defeat and for the first 30 minutes went almost toe to toe with their hosts. A mature team may not have forced the phases so hard and gained more from prolonged periods of pressure in the Ealing 22. An exceptional Trailfinders side punished every mistake but with the half-time score at 19-6 it was still a contest. Ampthill lost their composure in the second half, and as the error count grew so did Ealing's score. Ealing eventually went over for eight tries and a 54-6 victory.





"For periods of the first half we showed we can compete with the very best in this level," Lavery commented afterwards. "However, we demonstrated our naivety by forcing plays and some poor decision-making was capitalised upon by a very efficient side.

"Our set-piece was working well, we competed in the scrum but again our failure to convert scoring opportunities and be clinical at the right moment has resulted in an 8-0 try result. We'll learn from it and there are plenty of positives to take"

Round 3 saw the visit of Nottingham in a repeat of Ampthill's first ever Championship fixture back in October 2019. Both teams were at similar stages in their training, both had played Ealing and lost by 50 points, and both were looking for their first victory of the season!

Nottingham struck first with a breakaway try from Luke Mehson but braces from James Flynn and Dave Ward, plus a fine individual try from Will Brown, saw Ampthill claim their first victory and a bonus point with a 31-15 win.
