

ARTICLE I. NAME OF STUDENT ORGANIZATION

The organization shall be called [Korean Student Cultural Association (Ko.SCA)] at UCSD.

ARTICLE II. STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

The Korean Student Cultural Association at University of California, San Diego is a nonprofit student association organized to construct and maintain a comforting environment for Korean International Students- providing a smooth transition into UCSD. We strive to help students adapt to their newly found environment far from home with the following: (1) recreational social events such as freshman and transfer student rallies that brings unity and welcomes new people into our community, and (2) academic workshops and information sessions on scheduling and studying abroad summer programs. Our independent student run organization will host many events throughout the year creating a shelter for stressed out students and bringing about a sense of unity by maintaining a close fit community in which students can rely on for information, stress relief, and provide a comfortable home like environment. Our organization will also strive to interact and collaborate with other likewise Korean societies and organizations across California, expanding our network and creating many more invaluable connections for the student body.

ARTICLE III. NONPROFIT STATEMENT

[Korean Student Cultural Association (Ko.SCA)] at UCSD is a non-profit student organization.

ARTICLE IV. REQUIREMENTS FOR MEMBERSHIP

One must be an undergraduate student at UCSD to be eligible to apply for membership. He or she must file an application form for the interview during an appropriate interview period. Members should be able to speak Korean fluently. No fee is required for our membership.

ARTICLE V. FREQUENCY OF ORGANIZATION MEETINGS

Korean Student Cultural Association (Ko.SCA) holds a board member meeting at least once in every two weeks during weekdays on a time where all members can participate without affecting their own academic schedule. Absence is only accepted in emergency cases, and members should notify to president or vice-president prior to the meeting if they cannot attend meeting. Frequent unexcused absence may be a reason for expulsion.

ARTICLE VI. QUALIFICATIONS FOR HOLDING OFFICE AND METHODS OF SELECTING AND REPLACING OFFICERS

Only registered UCSD students may hold office in the organization. Only registered UCSD students may vote in elections for the selection of the organization's officers.

The officers of Korean Student Cultural Association (Ko.SCA) shall be one president, one vice-president, and one manager and at least one member for each team. Our association has three teams: event planning, marketing, and management. President, vice-president, and

team managers will interview and select officers. President, vice-president, and team managers have authority to select next president and vice-president to lead the association.

ARTICLE VII. RISK MANAGEMENT

Korean Student Cultural Association (Ko.SCA) at UCSD is a registered student organization at University of California, San Diego, but not part of the University itself.

Korean Student Cultural Association (Ko.SCA) at UCSD understands that the University does not assume legal liability for the actions of the organization.

Korean Student Cultural Association (Ko.SCA) holds several events starting from education workshops and recreational events that require physical activities. Members might encounter situations in which they must deal with minor injuries of participants of our event, Korean Student Cultural Association (Ko.SCA) prepares first aid kits and different procedures in case of such events.

ARTICLE IX. FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT

Korean Student Cultural Association (Ko.SCA) will raise funds by selling Korean traditional foods at the library walk or holding bazaar. We will not submit a budget to the A.S. or G.S.A finance committee quarterly.
