We then immediately convened our membership meeting as there were no nonmembers in attendance and Secretary Von Hagen then asked if there were any revisions to the report that was emailed to the membership. There were none so the minutes were accepted as submitted.

Dennis McCarthy gave the Treasurers report and it also was approved as submitted. There is currently \$59,000 in the general fund.

Under the Facility update it was reported that the sale of lot 7 is complete, BLU is paid off, the deed is being transferred and we will soon legally own the bottomlands of Wildwood Lake. The BLU members were recognized for their vision, commitment and for funding the initial purchase. The membership was

also recognized for paying off the land contract with BLU four months early. Ernie then presented a plan the Board had previously approved to replace the windows and vinyl side the clubhouse. After his presentation the membership unanimously authorized the board to move forward and approved \$35,000 of the general fund to pay for the improvements. <u>Lake Committee Report:</u> (Presented by Blair Wickman)

Loon Update: Geese chased Loons off man-made nest, then moved to island. Believe some animal ate Loons eggs. Loons stop nesting and moved off the lake after fighting with the geese on the island...believe they are now on Echo Lake. Looking at new man-made Loon nest designs, and possibly installing two (2) nests at different locations. Looking for volunteers to build nests and possibly form a long-term Loon committee.

2021 Treatment Schedule: First treatment was performed on June 28th. Triple treatment in SE corner of lake, and treated eurasian watermilfoil with Aquastrike and algae with Cu. (Note: we cannot treat lake areas of undeveloped property.) Second treatment was not performed in August due to excellent results from the first treatment, but will be combined with the fall lilly pad treatment on Sept. 14th. If this combined fall treatment helps prevent the nuisance weeds from appearing next spring, then we need to decide if we want to change to only 2 treatments per year.

Freshwater Jellyfish: Have seen some freshwater jellyfish in the lake; not native to Michigan. They like fresh, clean water so indicates our lake is in good shape, but be aware they have a non-hazardous sting.

Eagles: There have been eagles perching in tree's between Zack's and former Millie Mann properties...please be aware.

Dam & Draw Down Committee Report: (presented by Greg "Doc" Perry)

- **2021/22 Drawdown Status:** Dam committee will attempt a 24" drawdown starting on Oct. 1st, at a maximum rate of 1 inch per day, ending no later than Nov. 1st. Pre-drawdown will start on Sept. 15th to maintain overflow flush with top of Dam prior to actual drawdown.
- Lake Drawdown Permit Revision: Document revision submitted to EGLE to move the drawdown stop date from Nov. 1st to Nov. 30th. Permit revision in Stage 2 of 4 of the EGLE review process.
- **Tri-Annual Inspection:** Spicer performed on July 21st, with local sheriff and 911 coordinator present as well. Report pending, issue with outflow

- tube that will need to be addressed as outlined in report. Overall, Dam in good shape.
- **Recognition:** Dave Dohring is stepping down as chairperson of the Dam & Drawdown Committee and was recognized for his many years of leadership on this important activity.

Social Activities/Events:

- **Pontoon Poker Run**: Event raised \$910 for the Association. Event to be held on Aug. 6th in 2022. **Need a coordinator for next years event...contact a BOD if willing to chair this event in 2022!**
- Clubhouse Grass Maintenance: Dave Andrusiak recognized members who helped out this year, including Dave Dohring, Bill Staples, Justine & Denny Gallagher, George Jackson, Greg Perry, Steve Johnson, Ernie Zack, Bill Harding, Dale Duquet, Jim Nihls, & Mike Von Hagen. Also, special thanks to Ken Adams and Cyndi Jackson for repairing and re-painting the Wildwood Lake sign at Wurm Road, and to Kathie Nihls and Nancy? Steele for flower gardening at the clubhouse.
- **Golf Outing:** The 24th Annual Association Golf Scramble was held on Saturday, July 17th and had 17 teams participating, and generated a \$4,700 donation for Brave Hearts. 2022 Goal is 18 teams and \$5,000 donation for Brave Hearts.
