





3-4 Literacy Choice Board

It makes the /d/ sound.</p>	<p>Play tic, tac, toe with your child.</p> <p>Use the word alliteration. Look all the words begin with /t/.</p> <p>Builds critical thinking and conversations.</p>	<p>Laying in your bed at night.
