




Pre-K/ K Literacy Choice Board

Pick a square. Do the activity together. Color the square.
Repeat each day until all squares are colored.

<p>Take turns using rhyming words. You say wish and the next person playing has to provide a rhyming word such dish. Play until someone gets 10 right.</p>	<p>Scatter <u>large letters</u> around the room. Play favorite music and stop. Find a letter that is used in your name, stand on it and freeze. Identify the letter.</p>	<p>Using index cards write down 2 of each familiar <u>sight words</u>. Shuffle the cards. Have the child turn over two at a time. Play until all cards are matched. If they match they can keep the pair; otherwise they have to put them back.</p>	<p>Let your child pick several books and their favorite place to read and spend 20 minutes reading together.</p>	<p>Recite or read your favorite nursery rhyme and act it out for someone else. Be sure to create your props or costume!</p>
<p>On a walk in your neighborhood, find streets that begin with each letter in your first or last name. Write the street names down on a clipboard. Use your <u>ABC chart</u> for help if needed.</p>	<p>Make a book by folding 2-3 sheets of paper in half. Title your book, write authors name. Record your story by writing words and illustrate your book. Read your book to someone you love!</p>	<p>Find five words in your home that begin with the middle letter in your name and write them down.</p>	<p>Using the letters in your family members names to play with alliteration. Point out words that begin with the same sounds that begin with each person's names. Take turns.</p>	<p>Pick out three new words you did not know while reading a story. Call a friend or relative to discuss the definitions.</p>
<p>Listen to someone read a story. Which was your favorite character? What happened in the story? How would you end the story if you were writing it?</p>	<p>Read a book with no words. Tell the story to someone else using your own words.</p>		<p>Write a note or draw a picture thanking someone for a service they have provided. Grocer, mailman, teacher, doctor, trash collector, ec.t</p>	<p>Create a list of chores you can do by yourself such as setting the tables, folding towels, cleaning up toys, making up your bed, watering flowers.</p>
