Aaron Judge breaks American League Baseball record with 63 homeruns in one season

Aaron Judge, born in Sacramento, CA, now plays for the New York Yankees. He stands at 6'8", and attended Fresno State University. He broke the American League record for homeruns in one season, on Oct 5, 2022, Aaron hit 62 homeruns. Roger Maris, also of the NY Yankees, held the record with 61 homeruns since 1961. In the playoffs, Aaron added one more homerun for a total of 63 homeruns this year.

The National League record was set by Barry Bonds with 73 homeruns in one season in 2001, when playing with the San Francisco Giants. Aaron Judge won American League's Most Valuable Player for the year, and will play for the NY Yankees again next year with a 9 year contract

worth \$360 million, after briefly considering playing for the SF Giants.

Also in baseball, the Houston Astros won 4-2 in the World Series against the Philadelphia Phillies in Game 6, November 5. Jeremy Pena won MVP from the Houston Astros.

In basketball news, it's the beginning of the NBA season, so far the Golden State Warriors have won most games on their home court in San Francisco, but lost all their away games, hopefully the Warriors will win more games on the road. — GZ

Duran Duran Inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame

Duran Duran is the first band to be nominated by fans and inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame November 5th, and aired on HBO Nov. 19th. As a long time fan, this is long overdue, they deserve it. Musicians are usually nominated by fellow musicians to the museum, located in Cleveland, Ohio.
