WNA General Meeting Minutes: August 9, 2007

The Woodmere Neighborhood Association met on Thursday, August 9, 2007 for its quarterly meeting at the Museum of Fine Arts Auditorium. President Sam Whatley called the meeting to order. The guest speakers were Councilman Charles Jinright, Mayor Bobby Bright and Mark Johnson, Director of the Montgomery Museum of Fine Arts.

Mark Johnson spoke first and invited everyone to pick up literature about exhibits now and upcoming at the Museum of Fine Arts. He said the museum is open to the public with free admission but donations are invited to help the Museum. Volunteers are needed at the Museum to conduct tours and man the front information desk. Call the Museum for details.

Councilman Jinright urged everyone to visit the Fine Arts Museum and thanked everyone for coming and taking pride in their community. He said he meets with Jimmy Gunn of the WNA regularly on parks in Woodmere.

Mayor Bobby Bright complimented Councilman Jinright on the good work he has done in our district. Mayor Bright said he wants to work to see the city keep growing. Mayor Bright said the Museum is owned by the city but the theater is owned by the Shakespeare Foundation. The state used to support the theater but no longer does so. They are trying to get that support back. The city provides landscaping for the theater and maintains Woodmere Park and Blount Park. The 90 plus acres fronting Vaughn Road are owned by two different entities and is divided into 50 acre and 45 acre segments. The owners of these properties have no assets and can not maintain the property. The owners are trying to negotiate with the city to perform the maintenance, but Mayor Bright said this would be illegal unless there was a formal turnover of the land. All parties will have to agree to turn the property over to the city. The Mayor wants to maintain this property like the rest of the park. The Blount homestead would not be included in this property exchange. The Mayor said we would see increased police force in the area soon and they would step up patrols in the park. He urged people to call police on any suspicious activity and call the Mayor if nothing is done.

In the business session, Treasurer Charles Collins reported that as of the end of June, 2007 the WNA account balance was \$2358.90 with \$200.00 received in the month of July for membership dues with expenditures of \$16.40. The account balance as of July 31st was \$2792.50.

Jimmy Gunn, Parks Committee Chairman, reported that his seven committee members have a good rapport with Wiley Steen of the Parks Department and Councilman Jinright. Jimmy reported there will be improvements in the park including repairs to the pond dam and other projects. There are plans to resurface the walking path in the park soon.

A report was presented by Jessie Donaldson concerning the Long Range Planning Taskforce Nominating Committee. The nominees for the Taskforce were announced and a meeting is planned for the initial organization of the taskforce.

It was announced that the 2007 WNA handbooks would be distributed at the end of the meeting to current members in good standing. Sam Whatley said the WNA currently has vacancies for the Secretary, Streets and Sidewalks Committee Chairman, Newsletter Editor and a Zone Coordinator

for Zone 6. If you know of anyone who would be willing to serve in these positions, please contact Sam Whatley.

WNA officers will be elected at the next General Meeting on November 8. Jimmy Gunn is chairman of the committee to submit nominations. Jimmy said there are approximately 750 homes in Woodmere and we need at least 60% participation in the Neighborhood Association. Jimmy urged residents and members to get more involved in the Woodmere Neighborhood Association and let's make Woodmere the #1 neighborhood in the city.





Send Clear Message

Most people are concerned about crime in their neighborhoods. They should be. But they can't expect the problem to be solved with a policeman on every corner or a new jail that would rival the RSA Tower in height to lock up everyone involved in crime.

The only real solution will come from the neighborhoods themselves. As neighbors, we should be willing to step forward when called upon without fear of retribution.

We can do this better by participating in neighborhood associations and especially by getting to know everyone on our block. Don't wait for someone else to come knocking; let's initiate the introduction ourselves.

As neighbors, we need to set an example, too. If we don't keep our own yards picked up, lawns kept up and houses fixed up, we are in essence saying "We don't care." Criminals see that attitude, too. They know the residents will allow things to take place there because they aren't asked to leave.

Call the police non-emergency number at 241-2651 when we see or suspect suspicious activity taking place. They may not respond as fast as we want, but they won't know if we don't call. And like a squeaky hinge, our repeated calls will get their attention.

The answer isn't moving away, but it is found in moving in -- into setting a good or neighborly example. When criminals realize we don't care, they won't either.
