



Star ID or Passport Required by October 1, 2020 to Fly in the U.S.

STAR ID is a step beyond an ordinary Alabama driver license or non-driver identification card and it meets all the requirements of federal law. Effective October 1, 2020, every air traveler will need a REAL ID compliant license/ID (STAR ID) or another form of identification for domestic air travel.

In order to be issued a STAR ID, applicants must present four documents to verify identity/date of birth, Social Security number and address of principal residence. If the applicant's name has changed from that displayed on the document produced (marriage, adoption, court order, etc), official documents verifying this change will be required.

You can get your STAR ID before your driver's license expires, but you will have to pay for the duplicate license. Alabama issues STAR IDs at all ALEA Driver's License Examining Offices. In Montgomery, that office is Alabama, Department of Public Safety, 1040 Coliseum Blvd., Montgomery, AL. (334) 242-414. If you call ahead and make an appointment, you will save a lot of time spent waiting in line. A list of proper documents is available on the Alabama Dept. of Public Safety's website:

http://www.alea.gov/dps/driver-license/star-id.

If you are a veteran and you want to have this indicated on your license for identification purposes, take a copy of your DD-214 with you to the Examin-

ing Office.

The STAR ID will be required in order to enter a Federal facility such as a Federal Courthouse after October 1, 2020.


