- Put up new curtains and blinds


- Clean the carpet

Crime Watch Dues



Sometimes it's wise to look back. As we compare our association to where it was a year ago, many things come to mind.

At the end of 2005 we had about 40 members, one zone coordinator, and two committee chairmen. A year later we had 145 members, five zone coordinators and five committee chairmen. During the past year we sponsored a Day in the Park, which brought 200 neighbors together to have fun and get to know each other. We produced four issues of the newsletter and launched our association's first website, www.woodmeremontgomery.com.

Our Parks Committee met with city officials and obtained better lighting and extended fencing. The Board began the process of long range park planning, so that our park of the future will be better than the one of today.



Our Board of Directors studied the By-Laws and made them more readable, concise, and efficient. In November our members took the bold step of raising membership dues to preserve the association and allow it to thrive.

All these things took time, hard work, and money, but the results are clear. Our neighborhood is safer, friendlier and more attractive. Poised to build on this foundation, we have the confidence that working together we can do many more things in 2007.
