Dead Trees

The dead trees along the streets are long overdue in cutting and removing them. It is the property owner's responsibility to remove dead trees. The City of Albuquerque will not come out and remove the trees on your property.

To determine if a dead tree is on your property or tree pruning is required

According to the City ordinance, your property line extends to the street curb in front, on the side and behind your home. If your property is on a corner lot and/or backs up to a street, you are responsible to remove or prune those trees.

What is the purpose of 311?

311 is a citizens' hotline. It's a simple way for you to report problems or ask questions about your community.

Call 311 for:

- Dog barking for most of the day or night
- Loud noises on property or street
- Loud music
- Large Vehicles/ RVs
- ATVs driven on streets and Parkway Park not STREET LEGAL- driver and ATV equipped
- Vehicles parked on the sidewalk
- Vehicle repairs on the street
- Construction- Code Enforcement Compliance (block walls, fencing, building construction)
- Graffiti
- Branches overhanging the sidewalk or street
- Weeds, dried shrubs or dead trees
- Stray animals
- Homeless in the area
- Sidewalks if damaged/vandalized
- Large item pickup
- City street maintenance, signs, street lighting

What is the purpose of 911?

Call 911 for any emergency that requires immediate assistance from the police, fire department or ambulance.

Call 911 for:

- Gun shots, illegal fireworks and explosives
- Suspicious activity, persons or vehicles
- Car accident
- Vehicle stolen or vandalized
- Animal has bitten a person
- Brush fire
- Stranger(s) in your neighborhood/ trespassing
- Homeless committing a crime
- Individual with an emergency health issue

Place these items in your blue recycle bin:

- Paper/Newspaper
- Magazines/Junk mail
- Corrugate Cardboard
- Brown Paper Bags
- Cereal and Cracker Boxes
- Milk & Juice Boxes
- Aluminum cans/tin cans
- Foil & pie pans
- Books/Phone books
- #1 & #7 Plastic Bottles
- Paper Egg Cartons
- Small Appliances

Place these items in your black trash bin:

- Yard waste/Wood
- Pizza Boxes
- All Plastic bags
- Garbage /food

GLASS RECYCLING

DO NOT put glass in your blue recycle bin. Glass can be recycled in the designated yellow bins at one of Solid Waste's numerous drop-off locations




