I almost died in June. It was an awful experience, but it was also a blessing. As most of you know, I like to plan things well in advance and make sure they go as planned. I had no control over anything while I was in the hospital. I had to let go and let God handle things, and God took care of me. I felt his presence. It was a relief to relax in his loving care.

My faith was strengthened. So many "coincidental" things happened, I had to give up rationalizing and admit that they were miracles—small, but miracles nonetheless.

Another blessing was that I was able to see clearly what is important and what is not. My petty frustrations were replaced with gratitude for the precious gift of life—a second chance. I looked beyond my roommate's crabbiness and saw the person inside, and I cared about her. I saw a ministry opportunity visiting the lonely in rest homes. People are what matters. I saw my sister recently, and she didn't "push my buttons." I just felt genuinely happy to see her. I'm alive! I'm going to try to not sweat the small stuff. When something starts to bug me, I'm just going to say, "I'm alive! I'm alive!"

Robert and I had some deep discussions, and I fell in love with him all over again. He was with me every day I was in the hospital. I thank God every day for such a great husband.

Finally, I had that "It's A Wonderful Life" moment of realizing that I am loved by others. It's so easy to slip into self-pity and depression. The pile of get-well cards I received from my CUMC family chased away my negative thoughts. I'm keeping those cards to remind me how lucky I am to be part of this loving, caring church. Thank you all for your thoughts and prayers!

Hygiene Kits/Food Pouches

Again, we can't thank our church family enough for your help with our two little mission projects - hygiene kits and food pouches. We have received a lot of donations over the past few weeks for which we are most thankful. A lot of the donations have come from people who have brought back items from their hotel stays while on vacation. This month, we were able to take a total of 50 hygiene kits to Hope Partners in Pomona. We are still sharing both the hygiene kits and food pouches with our homeless,



and low income brothers and sisters who come to the church during the week.

Again, if you happen to be shopping, we are always in need of any donations you might find. The hygiene kits require small "travel" size containers of the following items: soap, shampoo, conditioner, combs, deodorant, lotion, toothbrush/toothpaste, bottled water and toilet paper. For the food pouches, we need potted meat, chips, cookies, fruit cups, granola bars and bottled water. Every little bit helps!

Food pouches are made up on an "as needed" bases depending on the amount of



pouches going out and the supplies available. We will be making up 50 hygiene kits during the latter part of July or the first of August. An announcement to follow. Any and all church members who would like to help with this project would be most appreciated.
