PALM SUNDAY, April 14

AFRICAN PALMS USA - An Outreach Mission to Africa Using the cross of Christ to help people help themselves.

The crosses are handmade by families in 9 villages in Masasi, Tanzania. Each year vast quantities of native palm crosses are purchased from Tanzanian villagers, providing them a ready source of family income. The crosses are then marketed to churches across the U.S. The net proceeds are returned

to African communities in the form of grants to meet basic human needs. Since it's beginning in 1976, the sale of crosses has enabled African Palms USA to provide \$1,600,220 in self-help grants to meet basic human need in Africa. We will, once again, be distributing the crosses on April 14, Palm Sunday. If you would like to recycle any of your crosses, please place them in the basket on the table in the Narthex.

EARTH DAY CELEBRATION - April 18

It fought for women's full laity and clergy rights when the church told them this was incompatible with Christian teaching. The UMW is an official agency of the UMC. It is independently funded by members, and its board of directors is independently elected.
