East District UWF Annual Celebration

The East District United Women in Faith (UWF, formerly UMW) had their annual celebration at Riverside First UMC (where our dear Robert Philips Worships and plays the organ!) There was Probably one last year, but no one from Chino attended. I attended this year. And had the pleasure Of sitting with our new District Superintendent, Rev. Moonyoung Lee.

This event included a morning gathering, a worship service with a message by the guest speaker, Jane Stewart, followed by Holy Communion, then ending with the business meeting. At the meeting Portion, the new officers were officially installed. Ms. Stewart's message was "Just as We Are— Living our Faith Together." At the end, there was a light luncheon with a baked potato bar.

I was proud to represent Chino UWF! We are small, but we make a difference. I learned about Some new things that I will bring to our own local at our next meeting. I urge anyone who hasn't Done so to look up the United Women in Faith. They do a huge amount of good throughout the World. As early as 1869, church women who were concerned about hunger, poverty, education and Medical care organized to address these needs focusing on the situations of women and children. Their work expanded to encompass the world. Their modern focus is "Justice and Freedom" Through action.

Chino United Methodist Church History

1925– 1955 Plans were laid and carried out for the present sanctuary, educational unit, and Parsonage. The old building was moved to the back of the property and remodeled As the social hall. The financial report showed donations of \$13,879 for the project And a bank loan was obtained in the amount of \$23,000, of which all but \$15 was Spent. The Whatsoever Class became very active, with a large membership. Adult School and various groups grew in membership and maintained a full schedule of Events. Five-dollar banquets and pence banks were used to pay the church's debt. A Kimball pipe organ was donated by the daughters of Mr. William Hickson. The Organ was built for Mr. Hickson's home and was moved into our new sanctuary in 1932. The Women's Service Guild was formed in 1933, with Mrs. Seth Hastings as its First president. In 1940, the group's name was changed to "The Women's Society For Christian Service", and Mrs. Austin Grant was president. The mortgage on the Church was burned in 1944, and the church's Golden Jubilee was celebrated in 1945 The Men's Club became very active and assisted in forming Boy Scout Troop #202. The church membership grew from 200 to 500.
