Dear church family,

You may recall that earlier this year your church council requested that a Paragraph 213 process be conducted to evaluate the viability of our church. As a part of that process the Rev. Siosaia Tu'itahi, East District Superintendent (DS,) and Rev. Catie Coots, Change Manager, conducted numerous consultations and document reviews to assess the sustainability if our church.

This past Sunday our DS and Rev. Coots met with approximately 40 of our church members to provide a brief overview of the viability of CUMC and to discuss some scenarios for CUMC membership to consider as they plan for the future.

Like many other churches with aging congregations, CUMC's membership has diminished as members passed away or relocated their families. Sadly, our shrinking membership has contributed significantly to our diminishing financial situation. Equally unsettling, we have fewer and fewer members available to pitch in to provide administrative support or volunteer for leadership positions.

Last, we have a looming deferred maintenance problem that will need to be addressed as we move forward. Although our aging rental units and parsonage have been a welcomed source of income, we cannot ignore that maintaining these resources may be costly. In addition, our church buildings will need additional roof repairs and the exterior paint is beginning to peel.

Our Equitable Compensation award will terminate at the end of June. It is *extremely* unlikely that our District will provide Equitable Compensation assistance to subsidize our new pastor's salary. Our future plans must consider our financial resources.

It is clear that our present direction is not sustainable. We need to prayerfully consider new options that balance our financial and volunteer resources as we plan for the future of our church. Here are several of the scenarios discussed at our recent Paragraph 213 meeting:

Requesting a part-time pastor

Requesting a student pastor

Requesting an intern pastor

Merge with other churches

Merge with other churches on neutral ground (a campus new to all of the churches)

Make a Plan to "buy another year" (so we can determine the best strategy to follow)

Close our church down

Securing another church/organization to use (and rent) our facilities

Seek rental opportunities (weddings/receptions/concerts)

Additional Considerations

Pastoring has changed. In addition to ministering to the flock and delivering sermons, today's United Methodist pastor has a heavy administrative workload. Data requests, committee assignments and report generation are the norm. Today's pastors need to be not just technologically savvy; they need to be near experts.

The money saved by requesting a part-time or student/intern pastor may not necessarily guarantee savings or success. If a pastor is not skilled in the administrative workings of the United Methodist Denomination, or technologically gifted, someone in the church will need fill that gap. The question remains are there technologically gifted church members who are both able and willing to serve as a pastor's tech backup?

Church mergers require intense planning, and dedicated volunteers. Do we have a sufficient number of volunteers who are willing and able to serve on the committees necessary to make a church merger a reality?

Planning to "buy" another year to figure things out, as well as closing our church will require a devoted group of volunteers willing and able to dedicate the time necessary to steer these options to fruition. Last, soliciting other churches and organizations to use (and rent) our facilities may require building upgrades, a dedicated staff person to manage the facilities and additional paid or volunteer custodial support. **Wrapping it up...**

Our problems are not unique. Many, many small churches face the same challenges. No one is to "blame." Where do we go from here? One of the consistent themes that Rev. Catie Coots shared from her interviews with our members was that "We don't want to let one another down, or hurt one another's feelings."

My friends, admitting that we can no longer continue to worship exactly as we have in the past is *not letting anyone down* – it is identifying and working with our reality.

Admitting that we can no longer continue to worship exactly as we have in the past is not "letting anyone down," it's giving us all permission to plan what we want our church to become.

Please discuss our Paragraph 213 meeting and this letter with your friends. And stay tuned, we will be having additional ZOOM meetings to address our way forward.
