## Women's Bean Project

During her time as a volunteer at a women's shelter, Jossy Eyre recognized that these women needed something more. They needed support services to overcome the barriers to employment they faced. They needed job readiness and life skills in order to get a job and be able to keep a job. With \$500 of her own money, she bought some beans and hired two women. That was 30 years ago. Since then, Women's Bean Project has helped over 1,000 women transform their lives.

Tamra Ryan, CEO, explains that regardless of the circumstances that led women to experience chronic unemployment and poverty, it becomes a trap. The problems compound, creating numerous and overwhelming barriers to employment, including histories of addiction, incarceration, and homelessness. Through a 6-9 month program, Women's Bean Project provides jobs, training, classes, and supportive services from case managers and community partners. This is a wrap-around approach, which is what is needed to help break the cycle and make lasting change.

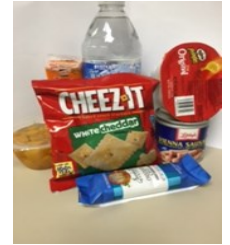
# Greetings from the Wonderful World of the Chino United Methodist Church and of course The M & M Groupo:
