On Sunday, August 12th, several members came across and unhoused woman sleeping on the steps Of the social hall, right by the alley. As I worried about our members being disturbed or feeling unsafe, And upon consulting with some members, I chose to call the Chino PD dispatch. Since the service was about to start, I was not outside when the police came by, roused her, and got her to change locations. I received a text message that the situation has been resolved. However, when I went out to double check, she was still there. It turns out she returned. I called the police department again and they sent out a deputy again. I did speak to him then. He was incredibly kind and understanding. The woman's name is Elizabeth. He knew who she was and said her usual hangout was on 7th Street. He added that she was not aggressive. He also told me that a "quality of life" officer would be checking with her the next day. I know that we have homeless/unhoused people on our campus all the time, but I do Understand it's been less frequent since we've locked up/shut-off the outside water access. I know that it's our job to be compassionate and welcoming...we even have a sign that says, "You Are Wel-come"!! But the protective side of me was very concerned for our members and property. I didn't know If she would become aggressive. There are so many stories out there that had me very concerned. When I talked to Officer Gomez, he was reassuring. I told him of my dilemma of wanting to be compas-sionate, but wanting to be protective of my fellow church members. Here's what he assured me of: The Chino PD is very equipped to handle this situation. They have the resources and the experience. This is part of what they do. # September 2023

## Chino United Methodist Church History

1895-1925: The congregation met in the old opera house at 7th and "D" Streets; moved to the Christian Church; moved to the schoolhouse on 5th Street (later called the Thimble Clubhouse, now the Chino Historical Society Museum); and then moved to the Knights of Pythias building at 711 "D" Street. The Ladies Aid was organized, and the Sunday School was active. A store building was purchased and remodeled for about \$1,000.00 as the church's first permanent home. A Commodious new church was built on Sixth Street, between "C" and "D" Streets, for about \$3,500.00, and the old building was sold to the Catholic Church. A parsonage was purchased. During this period, the Epworth League became an active part of the church. The church was Moved (literally) to Riverside Drive and 6th Street, its present location. Membership passed 200, And the Pastor's salary reached \$1,500.00. The Women's Home Missionary Society, with Mrs. N.C. Burbank as president, were organized. Good music was stressed, and hymnals were purchased. During the 1920s, the young people's group was very active, and the women worked for the Red Cross. Church membership passed 300, and the pastor's salary was \$2,300.00.

Petite Cheese Cakes

- 2 8-oz. pkg. Cream cheese
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 Tbsp. lemon juice
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- 24 vanilla wafers
- 1 can cherry pie filling
- Cup Cake liners

Beat cream cheese, sugar, eggs, lemon juice, and vanilla until fluffy.  
Put cupcake papers in muffin tins. Put a vanilla wafer in each paper. Place about 1 heaping Tbsp. of filling in each. Bake 375 10-15 min. Cool. Top with a little cherry pie filling on each. Chill.
