1955—1979 During the 1950's and 1960's, members of the church were instrumental in The formation and operation of the chino council of Social Services (COSS) And chino neighborhood house. Also during this period, the church began A 25-year relationship with Reverend and Mrs. E. Hoyt Smith, missionaries In Pakistan. By the mid-1960's, church membership had grown to 600. During The early 1970's, the congregation experienced a decline in membership and Interest which seemed to affect churches all across the land. As the community Began to grow rapidly, the congregation began mobilizing to meet the needs Of the changing community. Under the leadership of Reverend Stanly Creighton And Reverend Michael Higgs, the church continued its emphasis on strong Support for missions, quality music programs, and Christian education. The Congregation continued lending significant support to the ministry of Reverend And Mrs. Smith in Pakistan until their retirement in 1978, church attendance Showed significant growth. A planning and Strategy committee was formed to Make recommendations to the church's ministry about our changing community.
