# I See a New Church

In light of recent developments, our beloved United Methodist Church may be **very** different in a few years, and Bishop Hagiya asks everyone to become proactive in determining just what our "New Church" will look like, the missions and ministries we support, and the kind of Christians we choose to be.

On Sunday, September 8, following worship, we will hold a meeting in which we discuss the current issues in the UMC; our place in the East District, Cal-Pac Conference, Western Jurisdiction, and international UMC; who we are and who we would like to be; what steps need to be taken in order to accomplish our goals. Please plan to be in attendance!

Following this meeting, a writing team will develop a statement that will be published in the October issue of *The Tidings*. This document will be discussed at a specially-called Church Council meeting on October 13, after which a final draft will be written. Ultimately, the Chino UMC "I See a New Church" report will be adopted at our Charge Conference on Sunday, October 20, 2019.

In the meantime, as we think about our meeting on September 8, here are a few (of the many) questions to consider:

- Who are we, as United Methodists?
- What central mission and purpose is your church called to at this time?
- What is the central need of your neighborhood and surrounding community?
- How can your church fulfill its purpose in "Making Disciples for the Transformation of the World?"
- What compelling missional message would relate to the non-churched people living in your community?
- Who is God calling your church to be?

Let us all hold Chino UMC, the Cal-Pac Annual Conference, and the entire UMC in our prayers as we move forward in this journey of faith!

# <u>WHY SHOULD YOU ATTEND A BIBLICAL WOMEN WORKSHOP, ESPE-</u> <u>CIALLY IF YOU'RE A MAN?</u>

I am so glad that you asked! Our history books contain much information about the lives and achievements of men, but the accomplishments of women have been sorely overlooked. The same is true with women in sacred texts. Therefore, it is necessary to take a closer look at the women in the Bible, named and not named. If you cannot list at least 20 Biblical women and note something about them, you need this workshop! Join us on Saturday, September 21, 9 a.m. to noon, in our social hall. We'll study some of the women in the Bible, talk about what life was like for women in Bible times, and watch a film. Depending on interest in this topic, this might turn into a monthly class. Be sure to add your name to the workshop signup sheet in the narthex.

## Here are some facts about Biblical women:

Deborah was the only female judge of Israel (Judges 4-5).

The prophetess Anna was 84 when she saw young Jesus in the temple (Luke 2:36-38).

When Nabal saw his wife, Abigail, bringing all kinds of gifts to David, Nabal died, and Abigail married David (I Samuel 25:18-20).

Miriam, sister to Moses and Aaron, was once afflicted with leprosy for being rebellious (Exodus 15:20, Numbers 12:1-2).

Esther, a Jewish girl, married a Persian emperor (Esther 2:16-17, 8:3-6) and helped save her Jewish people from extermination.

The mother of the Levitical priesthood was Elisheba, the wife of Aaron (Exodus 6:23). Abraham's second wife, after Sarah died, was Keturah (Genesis 25:1).

The Queen of Sheba traveled a great distance to see Solomon and test him with questions (1 Kings 10:1).

Jephthah's daughter, whose father was one of Israel's judges, was given to God as a burnt offering (Judges 11).

Lemuel's mother was noted as having taught wise sayings to her son (Proverbs 31:1). Ruth, a Moabite woman, was an ancestor of Jesus (Ruth 4:17).

Saul disguised himself before going to consult a medium, the Witch of En Dor

(1 Samuel 28:7).
