# From the Worship Committee

Our St. Patrick's Day "Green" contest was won by **Haley DeShazer** and **Betty Morrison**.

Once again, we sponsored the church's annual Easter egg hunt. Thanks to **Nancy Nichols** for hiding the eggs.

What's next? Glad you asked! On **Friday evening**, **May 31**, **7 p.m.**, we'll be holding a special **lay-led "Rising Above" service** to honor Ascension Day.



What is Ascension Day? Well, according to the Acts of the Apostles, after Jesus was resurrected on Easter, he appeared to many people for 40 days (that special Biblical number), telling his disciples about God's Kingdom. On the 40<sup>th</sup> day, he told them that the Holy Spirit would soon come upon them (on the 50<sup>th</sup> day, Pentecost), to give them special power. He then reportedly ascended into Heaven as "a cloud received him out of their sight."

According to the Gospel of John, the Ascension occurred immediately after the Resurrection, with no 40-day waiting period, and no 40-day period is noted in the Gospel of Luke.

Ascension Day was first celebrated in 68 A.D. Saint Augustine claimed, several hundred years later, that it originated with the apostles. The day entered the liturgical calendar late in the third century, but it was not a topic of Christian art for another hundred years. It was thought to be redundant to say that Jesus ascended into Heaven, because he <u>was</u> Heaven. One of the earliest depictions of the Ascension shows Jesus at the top of a hill, grasping God's hand, which emerged from a cloud to pull him Heavenward, while the apostles watched in wonder.

The site of the Ascension is thought to be Mount Olivet, near Jerusalem. A legend indicates that a stone on the hill bore Christ's footprints. Jewish historian Josephus was impressed by the footprints. Repeated trampling by Roman soldiers failed to wear them away.

Constantine's mother, Helena, had a church built over the Ascension rock in the fourth century, but it was destroyed by Persians. A second church on the site was destroyed by Muslims, who left only a small octagonal structure that was incorporated into the present church as an oratory. The Ascension stone is reportedly in the oratory.

The Ascension story is thought by some to be evidence of aliens visiting our planet, and by some to be just a nice story. Others think it really happened. What do you think?


