HUNT CARIBOU, PTARMIGAN and FISH IN QUEBEC

This is a small scale fly-in hunting and fishing camp accommodating only 8 persons a week that is located on Lake Dufreboy in the Ungava Bay Region of Northern Quebec. They offer first class, fully guided, hunting and fishing. Whether you are in search of "world class" Caribou, fishing for trophy Lake Trout, Arctic Char or Brook Trout, upland game hunting for Ptarmigan, a venue for a corporate outing or a relaxing family holiday, you and your party will be priority #1 of this outstanding outfitter. They offer professional, personalized service and their success rate over the past 15 years is higher than any other outfitter for the plain and simple reason that he can focus on you and you alone. Each morning you will leave camp by boat along with your guide. Each guide usually has their favorite areas to hunt but a lot of thought goes into the final decision every morning based on what went on the day before. Each day is different depending on what the animals are doing.



You could be purely spot and stalk, wait in ambush or a combination of the two. Your guide will be with you to help you judge the quality of the bulls that you are seeing as caribou all tend to look massive. This is primarily the Leaf River Herd which is the largest and healthiest herd in northern Quebec; however you will also see a mix of the George River Herd throughout the season. The camp operates its caribou hunts during prime time beginning mid-August and running through the end of September and can be enjoyed with rifle, bow or black powder.

Northern Quebec's migratory caribou herds crisscross an area of over 400,000 square miles. According to the Government of Quebec's 2001 census, the Leaf River herd has more than doubled since 2001 up from 260,000 to 628,000 and the George River herd includes about 385,000 caribou. The Leaf River herd has been most reliable in both migration time and pattern as well as trophy quality. In hunting a migratory herd, most of your time will spent

glassing the open tundra in search of groups of large bachelor bulls as

well as solitary bulls in search of a harem of his own.

During the hunt, everyone must wear at least 400 square inches of hunter orange that is visible from all directions. Minimum rifle caliber is .243. Handguns are not permitted and are illegal. It is highly recommended that you make use of a scoped rifle, have better than average optics, top of the line hunting boots, and good quality rain gear. During the caribou hunt, clients are welcome to purchase additional licenses which would allow them to fish or hunt for ptarmigan during open season. The licenses are available in camp and payable in cash.

Note: Fishing and Ptarmigan hunting is available on all caribou hunting packages for the additional cost of the license fee only. The rate of \$7,995.00 is inclusive from Montreal and includes the two permits.

*In addition to the cost of the hunt would be a hotel room in Montreal and depending on whether you drive or fly into Montreal would determine whether you would need just one night before you depart or a night at each end. This runs about \$130.00 / night but could have that divided by 2-3 hunters. That's up to you. Of course you would have dinner / breakfast and drinks to cover and any meals or expenses enroute. Basically bring your gun or bow, sleeping bag and personal gear and leave the rest to the outfitter 6-8 Hunters

The outbound flight will depart Montreal (YUL) - Kuujjuaq (YVP) via First Air at 8:00 A.M. (2 1/2 hours) arriving



Kuujjuaq at 10:20 AM.

The return flight: Kuujjuaq (YVP) back to Montreal (YUL) at 4:50 PM arriving 7:15 PM. They will be met at the airport in Kuujjuag and transferred to the float base. The flight into camp is approx. 45 minutes on a turbine Otter on floats.

A \$1,000 deposit is required. This truly is a good adventure and still having a two caribou permit for this season is a definite plus in value.

Upland game hunting in northern Quebec is one of the most unique bird hunting

opportunities available to shotgun hunters today. Ptarmigan hunting is done over dogs during late September and early

October. This is when the birds are starting to form fairly large covies. Two hunters per guide and one dog per two hunters is included in the cost of the hunt. Additional dogs can be brought from the minimal charge of the airfare from Montreal to Kuujjuaq and return. The birds will be almost pure white at this time of the year and offer excellent sport as well as great fare for the table. Limit is 15 birds per day with 30 birds in possession with a valid game permit.

This is world class fishing and is catch and release. Fishing can be enjoyed during the entire hunting season with the purchase of a fishing license. Fishing only packages are available for the first two weeks of August during which time the Brook Trout are abundant in the river, Lake Trout are at prime and the Arctic Char are there as well. Primarily you will fish for Lake Trout on the surface throughout the entire season and many are caught weighing into the 40 pound range. On the average the fish will range from 8-10 pounds while the Brook Trout will be from 2-3 pounds. Fly fishing for the Brookies is fantastic.

All Packages Include: reception and transfer from commercial jet to float

plane charter in Kuujjuaq, round trip charter airfare from Montreal to camp at Kuujjuaq, applicable licenses, all applicable taxes (PST & GST) with non-resident rebate issued, packages are guided 2 hunters per guide, licenses related to package booked, fully equipped guide with boat, motor and unlimited fuel, professional trophy preparation of capes & antlers, packing of meat in airline approved tote boxes, shipping of 125 pounds of meat from camp to Montreal, shipping of cape from camp to Montreal, shipping of split antlers from camp to Montreal.

Not Included in Packages: hotel accommodations in Montreal, meals in Montreal or reroute, accommodations if required in town due to weather related delays, personal affects, etc., firearm or bow, sleeping bags, pillow case, towel etc, soft drinks, beer, alcoholic beverages (make prior arrangements), shipping of baggage in excess of 75 pounds

Reservations & Payments Confirmation will be upon receipt of a \$1,000 non-refundable deposit to hold the dates. Balance to be paid 60 days before the trip. Due to the advance commitments necessary with aircraft, guides and equipment, in the event you must cancel your trip and are unable to find a replacement hunter/fisherman, no refund will be made. Balance is due June 1. You must also read, understand and accept by signing the <u>Terms and</u>

<u>Conditions</u>, <u>Release of Liability</u> and the <u>Hunting Contract</u>. Upon entry into the U.S. with a trophy, present your 3 copies of <u>Wildlife Declaration Form 3-177</u> (Google) first to U.S. Fish and Wildlife, then to U.S. Customs, and then to U.S. Department of Agriculture. You must keep the certified original. All clients must comply with the U.S. Department of the Interior/Fish and Wildlife Services laws, requirements and conditions.
