HUNT IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

This beautiful hunting territory is located in the heart of the Muskwa/Kechika wilderness area, a 4-million-hectare paradise in northeastern British Columbia. Our territory also encompasses the Tuchodi, Muskwa, and Kwadacha drainages within the Northern Rocky Mountain and Kwadacha Provincial Parks and is renowned as one of the premier Stone Sheep and Elk hunting areas in Northeastern British Columbia. Nowhere else in BC is the elk population thriving as it is in this area! As a result, the high numbers of all trophy game animals make this a hunter's paradise. For the past 30 years, this area has been hunted conservatively, and they will continue to employ this strategy in years to come.

Over 4 million acres of remote wilderness...With exclusive guiding and outfitting rights to over 4 million acres they offer one of the most remote and specialized hunting experiences possible with a wide variation in pristine wilderness habitats and terrain. They therefore have an abundance of elk and moose in the foothills of the eastern slopes of the Rocky Mountains where the lush vegetation supports an abundance of game. In the higher elevations of the alpine and mountain peaks, they hunt Stone Sheep and Goat. Elevations range between 2500 and 8500 feet. Wolf and Black Bear

are found throughout our entire area. Our base camp is at approx. 2500 feet, with the tall mountains to the west and foothills of 3500-4500 feet to the east.

This is an ideal location due to the outfitter's location within the Northern Rockies Park. The area will remain inaccessible by industry and development. There are no roads to or within the area and wheeled vehicles of any kind are prohibited. This territory is accessed by horse, aircraft or jet boat. They are based out of Fort Nelson, B.C. and are approximately 100 air miles southwest of this northern community.

STONE SHEEP

Conservative hunting of the area has produced trophy rams for generations. Most of the rams found in this area are the sought-after dark color phase.

Hunts are done from spike camp locations utilizing tents for accommodation and horses as transportation. Horses are used to allow access to the most remote mountain drainages where the best rams are often found. Although horses are used extensively, all hunters are expected to be in good physical conditions.

To hunt either Sheep or Goat, you will need to be able to ride, walk, and climb, and most importantly be able to shoot accurately after climbing and making a stalk. The priority on Sheep hunts is for rams, but other species including Goat, Moose, Elk, Caribou, Wolf, Grizzly and Black Bear are also available depending on the camp and season.



ELK

The Elk in this area are sought after for their massive, heavy beams. The number of Elk encountered during a hunt astounds clients. Because of our abundant game population, game regulations allow rifle and archery hunts during the rut. There are opportunities for monster 5-point elk!. There is a 95% success or better on 6 point bulls

A good percentage of rifle hunters will harvest their bull within bow range due to the high numbers of elk and the light hunting pressure. This outfitter hunts his 4 million + acres conservatively with no more than 2 hunters per camp. The camps are widely spread throughout the area creating great hunting opportunities from all locations.

COMBINATION HUNTS

Elk hunts can be combined easily with moose or goat options. These are very successful and it is possible for a hunter to harvest all three. An additional harvest fee is due when successful. Wolf is also included in this hunt at no extra charge. Tags must be purchased by the hunter before the hunt for all species.

A mixed bag hunt is available on September 1-15, 2017



MOOSE HUNTS – The Canadian Bull Moose produced in this area are some of the finest in Northeastern British Columbia. Our vast area supports large numbers of trophy-class bulls.

The pre-rut hunts are primarily horseback ‘spot and stalk’. At this time of the year, the bulls can be found summering in the high alpine valleys, near timberline. During the annual fall rut, our hunters can use rifle or bow to hunt moose. Moose become far more active during the rut and we utilize calling techniques to attract them into bow and rifle range. After the trophy is taken, there will be a \$1,500 air charter flight charge to get the meat out.

Each year they take a number of trophy bulls that qualify for the Boone & Crockett Record Book.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN GOAT



Goat Hunts – Rocky Mountain Goat can be found in most of their hunting area. Hunters concentrating on a goat as their trophy can expect to harvest a billy that could secure a place in the Boone & Crockett records. The big Billie's are in some of the steepest and most treacherous parts of the mountains where many of these Billie's reside.

Hunters need to be in good shape if they want to traverse. This is a hunt of skill and patience as goats are wary of any movement from below. A goat hunt may also be combined with a moose or elk hunt. This combination consistently produces excellent results. As with our other hunts, this is primarily a horseback hunt. We do, however, offer a limited number of boat-assisted backpack hunts as well.

BEAR/WOLF HUNTS

Hunters are strongly advised to bring Wolf and Black Bear tags along on all hunts. In order to harvest Wolves, you must be ready when the opportunity presents itself, so purchasing a tag prior to the hunt is a must. You may also have a chance to harvest a big Black Bear through spot and stalk. Although this area doesn't have large numbers of Black Bear, they do see good trophies every year. Come prepared! The Black Bear License and Tag fee is \$210 and you must own a B.C. hunting license (\$210). The Wolf License and Tag fee is \$60.

PARENT/YOUTH HUNT (10 -18 yrs. accompanied by adult)

- Adult books on regular 12-day one species hunt
- Youth pays only a charter fee, Hunting License/tag fee and a \$4,000 harvest fee per animal
- Youth between the age of 10 and 12 yrs. must use the adult's species tag, age 13-18 an purchase tags.
- Adult may take additional animals for harvest fee as specified
- Additional charges: Charter Fee and Hunting license and all species tags.

PRICE INCLUDES: All meals, accommodations, NRHPF, government royalty fee and 5% GST tax, capping, skinning, salting and field preparation of trophies.

PRICE EXCLUDES: hotels before and after the hunt, licenses, tags, all applicable taxes, shipping and crating (estimated between \$500-\$700), charter fee (\$1,500 or \$2,000 for Gataga and Jim River) depending upon which camp. special food, cost of medications, immunizations, hospitalizations and services of doctors, charges for evacuation or rescue by ambulance, helicopter or airplane and any other service or product that is not agreed or mentioned in this document.

RESERVATIONS & PAYMENTS: 50% deposit is required to secure you hunt dates. The balance is payable on or before June 30 in the year of your hunt. You must also read, understand and accept by signing the [Terms and Conditions](#), [Release of Liability](#) and the [Hunting Contract](#). Upon entry into the U.S. with a trophy, present to authorities your [Wildlife Declaration Form 3-177](#). All clients must comply with the U.S. Department of the Interior/Fish and Wildlife Services laws, requirements and conditions.

TRAVELING INTO CANADA:

This outfitter is based out of Fort Nelson, B.C. and are approximately 100 air miles southwest of this northern community. Fort Nelson is serviced by commercial flights from Calgary and Edmonton, Alberta as well as Vancouver, British Columbia. When traveling to Canada with a firearm, it is important that you fill out [Non-Resident Firearm Declaration \(CAFC 909\) form](#). The directions are printed on page 1 and 2 and the form is on page 3 & 4. If you take more than CAN\$10,000 into or out of Canada, you must fill out a [Customs Form](#)
