HUNT COUES DEER IN MEXICO

(*Odocoileus virginianus couesi*)

The majestic Sierra Madre Mountains is on eastern Sonora State, with elevations up to 7500 feet, are covered with oak and mesquite mixed with all types of cactus and brush. This is the perfect habitat for an abundance of the popular **Coues Deer**, which is a subspecies of the white tail deer and is found only in southern Arizona and Sonora, México.

HUNT DOVE IN MEXICO

The famous Sonora Green Belt offers the best hunting region in Northwest México, particularly for **Mourning and Whitewing doves**. Usually guests head out to the shooting areas at 6 a.m.; arriving approximately 45 min. later. Upon arrival, hunters are placed into position and the action begins. Every hunter is provided with a bird boy, who will carry the shells, refreshments and retrieve the birds, all under the supervision of the guides, who will take care of every detail. After the afternoon shoot, hunters head back to the hunting lodge, where they'll cleanup and rest. Each day ends with a celebration of the hunt and a superb dinner.

Clothing and equipment: Lightweight khaki or camo colored (two complete changes of clothes), down vest or jacket, raincoat/poncho, hat and sunblock lotion. You're allowed to bring 2 shotguns and 100 rounds of ammunition per gun; if you're planning to take doves back home, please bring a cooler. Also bring small bills for gratuities (we don't handle cash). Traveling to Mexico with shotguns has never been easier or safer: If you don't want to bother bringing them with you, we can furnish with one of our own: Berettas (12 and 20 gauge.), Benelli (in 20 gauge.) and Remington (12 and 20 gauge.)

How to get to Hermosillo: to avoid unnecessary delays and complications, travel through Phoenix to Hermosillo. Make an early afternoon connecting flight to Hermosillo. After proceeding through Immigration and Customs, you will be met by outfitter.
