

HUNT OCELLATED TURKEY IN MEXICO

(meleagris ocellata)

There may be up to 8 hunters in camp. The hunters arrive on Sunday to the lodge and will begin hunting in the afternoon of that same day. The hunt ends on Friday afternoon, 10 hunting outings in total. You will then be taken to your hotel in Merida or

Campeche. A typical hunting day starts with a wake-up call at 4:30. Hunters will be treated to a light breakfast with coffee, juice, fruit, cereal and toast. They will then start the journey by vehicles to the hunting areas. They will return to camp for lunch at 1:30. After a rest, they will return to the hunting area about 3:30 and hunt until dark when they return to camp for dinner at 8:00. The new Lodge is situated in the town of Cano Cruz and is only 11 miles from the hunting grounds. The Lodge consists of 6 chalets with air conditioning and an in suite bathroom. There is a large dining-living room, open bar, swimming pool, pool table, exercise area and beautiful gardens. Telephone is available.

Price Includes: Use of firearm (Browning Shotguns) and ammunition, 1 x 1 hunting, food, beverages(water, beer, soft drinks and domestic spirits), lodging, trophy preparation, trophy tag, use of 4x4 vehicle per 2 hunters and 2 guides.

Price Excluded: Document Package: \$490 which includes: Hunting Permit and License, Mexican CITES Export Permit, U.S. Import Permit Application, agent letter from authorizing receiving establishment, hunter's agent letter for importing trophies, U.S. Import declaration form for U.S. Fish and Wildlife, U.S. Customs and the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture, and Instructions for importation of CITES listed species; international bank wire transfer fees; tips; air fare; hotel and extras before and after hunt; tips to guide and ranch staff, non-scheduled ground transportation, phone calls; special food; cost of medications; immunizations; hospitalizations and services of doctors; charges for evacuation or rescue by ambulance; helicopter or airplane; and any other service or product that is not agreed or mentioned in this document.

Reservations & Payments: A non-refundable 50% deposit is required to confirm and reserve a hunt date. Final Payment is due 60 days prior to your hunt. You must also read, understand and accept by signing the Terms and Conditions, Release of Liability and the Hunting Contract.

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Itinerary: We recommend that you fly directly from Houston on United Airlines non-stop to Merida, arriving at 9:20 PM, drive 2 ½ hours to camp. Alternate route is to fly to Mexico City on either American Airlines or Aero Mexico and connect with a flight to Campeche. Please know that it is difficult to navigate through Mexico City airport. There is much confusion. This is another opportunity to have a delayed flight. Contact your travel agent to travel from other cities.

In the 2014 season, this lodge housed 72 hunters. They took 93 toms. All were taken from the ground. No birds are shot from the roost.

In 2013, the total bag for the 43 hunters hosted was: 62 Turkeys, 13 brocket deer, 9 Javelina, and 7 Coati Mundi There were several highlights during the season such as cat sightings (1 jaguar,4 pumas,1 jaguarundi), A new pending world record grey-brown Yucatan Brocket deer and the #6 overall brocket deer with a rifle and they were successful in using the FoxPro e-caller.
