**Price Includes:** pick up and drop off at airport by road (a surcharge of \$2,700 per flight hour will be added if transferred by helicopter), transportation to, from and in the hunting region, all serving staff, one interpreter per camp, Invitation Letter, firearm permit, accommodations and food in camp, service of a professional guide, service rangers, cooks, and maintenance staff in the hunting camp, one trophy fee of specie, hunting permit, state fee, Kyrgyz CITES Export Permit, custom clearance, and Veterinarian Export Certificate

Price Excludes: As of 7-24-12, US and Canadian citizens may receive a 60 days Visa at no charge at the airport upon arrival; U. S. CITES permit (if you are a U.S. citizen); International and Domestic Air Fares, trophy shipment, additional trophy(s), insurance, tips to professional hunter, guide and staff, lodging; drinks; meals and travel charges incurred before and after the contracted period of the hunt or because of national holidays; excess luggage fees charged by the airlines; extra hunting days (if available); personal expenses; non-hunter; special food; cost of medications; immunizations; hospitalization and service of doctors; charges for evacuation or rescue by ambulance; helicopter or airplane; and any other services or products not agreed upon or mentioned in this document. The Kyrgyz Republic CITES Export Permit will be waiting for you in Bishkek after the hunt. We recommend that you personally take your trophy home with you, see **Know Before You Go** article on our Home Page: www.HighMountainHunts.com **Reservations, Payments and Permits**: Per person in U.S. Dollars Only. Confirmation of your reservations will be upon receipt of a \$5,000 non-refundable deposit and you must also read, understand and accept by signing the Terms and

<u>Conditions</u>, <u>Release of Liability</u> and the <u>Hunting Contract</u>. The remaining balance is due and payable on or before April 1 of the hunt year.

Mag, .300 Wby.Mag, .300 RUM., .30-378 Wby.Mag with optics 3,5-10x,3-23X, 4-16X; 40-60 bullets; Optics: binoculars 70-47x; Rangerfinder 700-900m; Papers: As of 7-24-12, US and Canadian citizens may receive a 60 days Visa at no charge at the airport upon arrival, passport, Itinerary, Insurance, cash & cards, CITES Import Permit (for Macro Polo sheep), list of addresses and phone numbers in your country and hunting destination, your taxidermy address, diary, pen, reading material, maps. Clothing: 1-2 pair mountain boot, camp shoes, 2 pair hunting pants, 2 long-sleeve hunting shirts, 3-4 pair underwear, jacket w/hood, white camouflage, 1-2 sweaters, long sleeve thermal top, 3-4 t-shirts, 2 pair gloves, wool cap, cap w/ear-flaps, hunting cap, scarf or neck warmer, belt or suspenders, socks, warm or thermal socks, handkerchiefs. Miscellaneous: sleeping bag (for -4°F), body size pad for sleeping and sitting, lip balm, sunblock, walking stick, blister pads, 1 liter thermos, medications, scotch tape, zip-lock bags, camera (film, memory card, tapes, etc.), flashlight, radio, batteries, chargers (220V or adapter), sunglasses.

As the Marco Polo is in CITES II, a hunting license application will be made on your behalf to the Kyrgyz Republic State Agency for Environmental Protection and Forestry. The Kyrgyz Republic authorities then notify the CITES Secretary and he notifies USFW of your legal request to hunt and export and import your trophy. U.S. clients must personally and in advance, complete <a href="USFW Application Form 3-200-21">USFW Application Form 3-200-21</a> and mail to U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Division of Management Authority (DMA) Branch of Permits, MS: IA 5275 Leesburg Pike Falls Church, VA 22041-3803 1-800-358-2104 or 703-358-2104, return receipt requested to arrive on May 1 (not before May 1). The U.S. Fish and wildlife then issues the U.S. CITES Import Permit Form 3-201, normally issued in a minimum of 30 days after May 31 and with many requests averaging between 60-90 days. It is the exclusive responsibility of the hunter to comply with

all the U. S. Department of Interior Fish & Wildlife Service laws,

requirements and conditions.

**Travel:** You fly to Bishkek (FRU) via Istanbul (IST) on <u>Turkish Air</u>, Frankfurt or Moscow. It is best to travel through Istanbul because it is more difficult to get firearms through Frankfurt or Moscow. Permanent camps are comfortable, warm and the food is mostly Asian. You will have two guides and will use horses and will normally ride for approximately 2 to 2 ½ hours per day. Rams are not usually very far from camp. Weather permitting, hunters will use tents and stay on top; otherwise, hunters return to the base camp at night. Upon entry into the U.S. with a trophy (at a USW Designated Port ONLY), present to authorities your <u>Wildlife Declaration Form 3-177</u> (instructions) with 3 copies of the original of USFW CITES Import Permit Form 3-201.

Permanent camps are comfortable, and the food is Asian. Tent camps in remote locations are not as comfortable and the food is campfire food. This is a **Real Hunt**, not just a shoot. You should be in good physical condition!

**Price Includes**: pick up and return to airport by road, transportation to, from and in the hunting region, all serving staff, one interpreter per camp, Invitation Letter, firearm permit, accommodations and food in camp, service of a professional guide, service rangers, cooks, and maintenance staff in the hunting camp, one trophy fee of specie, hunting permit, state fee, Kyrgyz Export Permit, and Veterinarian Export Certificate. As of 7-24-12, US and Canadian citizens may receive a 60 days Visa at no charge at the airport upon arrival; Housing will be in house, cabin, yurt or tent.

**Price Excludes:** International and Domestic Air Fares, a surcharge will be added if transferred by helicopter to hunting region if requested, trophy shipment, additional trophy (s), insurance, tips to professional hunter, guide and staff,

lodging; alcoholic drinks; meals and travel charges incurred before and after the contracted period of the hunt or because of national holidays; excess luggage fees charged by the airlines; extra hunting days (if available); extra trophy; shipment of trophy (s); Trophy prep \$100 per trophy, personal expenses; non-hunter; special food; cost of medications; immunizations; hospitalization and service of doctors; charges for evacuation or rescue by ambulance; helicopter or airplane; and any other services or products not agreed upon or mentioned in this document. 
