MOUNTAIN GOATS

Hunting the majestic Mountain Goat, and just being in the country they inhabit, can be the unforgettable experience of a lifetime! Most hunters lucky enough to secure a trophy will tell you, "goats don't come easy!" Mountain Goat habitats in Alaska are harsh and unforgiving. Much time and energy are needed to successfully negotiate the poor late-season weather conditions and rugged terrain found on hunts for the long-haired trophy Mountain Goat. That's why the expertise and experience of this outfitter makes such a difference. He offers a custom late-season Alaska Mountain Goat hunt. He has had well over 100% opportunity and enjoyed a nearly 100% success rate and have been doing these hunts for 28 years. It is one of North America's most successful and sought after Goat hunts. The five-week season runs from the last week of October to the end of November. These goats, found only in the coastal mountains of Southeast Alaska, have incredibly beautiful long hair at this time of year. The goats are in rut during this season; combined with snow and cold weather, this pushes them to lower altitudes where they are more accessible, making the hunt enjoyable for everyone, without undue danger or stress. You'll fly to Juneau and take a seaplane flight to the 80-foot pleasure yacht. They will anchor in a small cove in the middle of mountain goat country and use their 16-foot aluminum boats to reach the hunting areas each day. After your day's Mountain Goat Hunt, you'll arrive back at the yacht to delicious meals, hot showers, and warm, comfortable beds. Goat hunts are very appealing for women as well as men.

BROWN BEAR

All bear hunts are conducted from this luxurious full-service floating lodge. Depending on your booking, you'll arrive in Petersburg, Juneau or Sitka, Alaska, and fly on a seaplane to meet the yacht. The outfitter will anchor in a quiet, secluded cove or bay and use our seaworthy 16-foot aluminum boats to reach our hunting areas each day, returning each evening to the yacht for delicious meals and relaxing accommodations while you share stories of your adventures. He operates on Tongass National U.S. Forest Service Land under an Authorized Special Use Permit. There is no need to put in for a draw. All hunts are allotted to him.

SITKA DEER

Sitka Deer hunts are generally conducted in Late November in combination with our late season Mountain Goat hunts. They are still in rut at this time and they are typically on the beaches and very accessible this time of year. We typically run 100% opportunity on these stocky unique beautiful deer, and typically 100% success as well, as there are very good populations in the hunting area. They run in score size typically 70 to 90 points on the B & C scale but do occasionally get some in the high 90's to 100 point range as well. They are fun and exciting to hunt, and have unique color and markings compared to any other deer species. All Sitka Deer hunts will be based on current weather and hunt conditions and can change at the last minute. Therefore, the Sitka Deer hunt would be paid for at the time of the hunt because of this.



PRICE INCLUDES: 1 animal (unless one of the combo hunts), all meals, comfortable lodging on the yacht each night, guided 1x1, and trophy preparation.

PRICE EXCLUDES: hunting license, expenses before and after the hunt, trophy fee for other animals, crating, shipping and handling, gratuities, float plan from city you have flown into to where the yacht is docked, special food, cost of medications, immunizations, hospitalizations and services of doctors, charges for evacuation or rescue by ambulance, helicopter or airplane, other items of personal nature and any other service or product that is not agreed or mentioned in this document.

RESERVATIONS & PAYMENTS: Per person in U.S. Dollars only, confirmation will be upon receipt of a 50% deposit with balance due 30 days prior to start of hunt. You must also read, understand and accept by signing the [Terms and Conditions](#), [Release of Liability](#) and the [Hunting Contract](#). All clients must comply with the U.S. Department of the Interior/Fish and Wildlife Services laws, requirements and conditions.

TRAVEL: arrive 2 days before your scheduled hunt date, spend the night and the next day fly out to the yacht on a float plane. The flight is not included in your hunt cost. Flight costs are based on a 185 Cessna, Dehaviland Beaver, and Otter. Prices average \$700 round trip — depending upon the number of passengers on board. Fly between 11:00 AM and 4:00 PM on the day before your hunt date. You will fly in & out of Juneau (JNU) and sometimes out of Petersburg for the Mountain Goat hunt. Alaska Airlines is our only year-round carrier, either via Anchorage or Seattle, either way it is about a 2-hour flight. Delta flies May through September. We recommend that you protect your hunt investment with travel insurance. Flights are always dependent on logistics like weather and where the boat is anchored. We plan on flying you out to the yacht sometime between 1-4 pm the day before your hunt starts. This allows you to go sightseeing and also gather up any last-minute essentials that you might require. If you plan on purchasing alcohol, this can easily be purchased at this time. Please let us know if you are interested in any side tours such as a day fishing charter, spa treatments, nice restaurants in town, historical sites and local flair. Purchasing restricted tickets is not recommended, as your party may want to change your return date. Airlines that fly to Southeast Alaska: Alaska Air provides daily air service to Sitka, and the cities of Juneau and Ketchikan on comfortable 737's. Alaska Airlines serves most major west coast cities and has new direct routes from Washington, D.C., Newark, N.J, and Boston, MA. It takes about 2 hours to fly to Southeast Alaska from Seattle. When flying into Sitka, there is usually a quick stop in Ketchikan or Juneau first.
